## Rodeo finals a boon for hard working Indian cowboys

### Local Cowboy done Well at INFR Finals

This year Casey Greene was the only contestant to qualify for the Indian National Finals Rodeo, which was held in Albuquerque, N.M.

In his first go, Casey made a quick catch but as he stopped his horse he slammed the calf down and it wouldn't regain its feet again causing Casey to take a no time. In the calf roping event a cowboy must throw the calf down, so if a calf is knocked down the contestant must let the calf regain his feet to be thrown and tied for the qualified time.

The second day Casey came out the winner of the go-round with a time of 10:5. A good run for the young cowboy who took the day money.

In the third go Casey had some problems with his catch and slowed him down and eventually ended up with no time. At press time there was no report on how Casey done on the final day of competition which was the final day at the INFR, for this year. Another year wrapped up and all the cowboy and cowgirls are all aiming at another season to get underway.

### The Indian National Finals A Big Goal.

What a great feeling it is to make it to the Indian National Finals Rodeo held in Albuquerque, New Mexico, each year. After a year of hard work participating and traveling from rodeo to rodeo and to come out one of the top two in their special

event to qualify them to represent his/her region is a great accomplishment for anyone.

There are ten regions throughout the United States and Canada, who send the top two contestants from each event to the finals. Throughout all these ten regions this includes 5000 Indian contestants who compete in all the sanctioned rodeos during the year. So you can imagine how tough it can get to make it to the finals.

All Indians both men and women who work hard all season long in their special events, all with the dream of making it to the INFR at the end of the year, where the worlds championships are at stake.

The six major rodeo events and the women's barrel race and break-away roping events are featured at the INFR. All year long the cowboys and cowgirls earn and pay their own way as they travel from rodeo to rodeo. Sometimes its an endless case of traveling and not even making a cent. But with their hearts they are in there participating for their share of

the glory of winning the regional title. It takes a lot of dedication and sacrifices by all contestants who have their goals set to compete at the Indian Nationals Finals Rodeo. This is where it comes down to the point of who makes the most points to compete with the other regional representatives where the Worlds Championships are at stake.

A person can't mess around all year waiting for the finals to come around and dig up enough money to enter in the finals. He has to earn his way by building up points all season long as each region has their dues the cowboy and cowgirls have to pay before their points are compiled and to determine who has built up the most points in order for them to compete in the regional finals, before he makes it to the National Finals. It is a long hard tough road to be able to be the one who represents the region he is in. The stock is the best in the world as they are on their way to the P.R.C.A. National Finals rodeo which will be held in Las Vegas later on in the year.

## Alps winter rodeos... One down with four to go

Each performance will get under way at 1:00 p.m.

Belt buckles will be awarded to the high points earned in each event at the end of the series. A trophy saddle to the All-Around champion at the end also. Points will be awarded to the top six places in each event. A team roper who places twice will receive points for highest place only.
