The Tigers of Ontario came to town for the first match-up hoping to prove they were worthy of going to state, but the White Buffaloes had other ideas which sent the Tigers home to pack their basketball gear away for the season. The White Buffaloes didn't waste any time as they went on the scoring rage leading 23-16, at the end of the first quarter. The Tigers who once beaten the Buffaloes kept the game

The Ontario tigers were not about to be left out as they came charging back in the third quarter to out score the Buffs once again 16-13, chipping away at the score as they cut the lead to 44-42, going into the final quarter. In the fourth and final quarter the Buffaloes woke up and saw that the Tigers were still around got things going with Jake Suppah the point guard started using his speed and skills handling the ball and scoring well to get the Buffaloes on track once again as they went on a 24 point scoring spree to close out the season for the Ontario Tigers with the final score the White Buffaloes 68, the Tigers 59.
