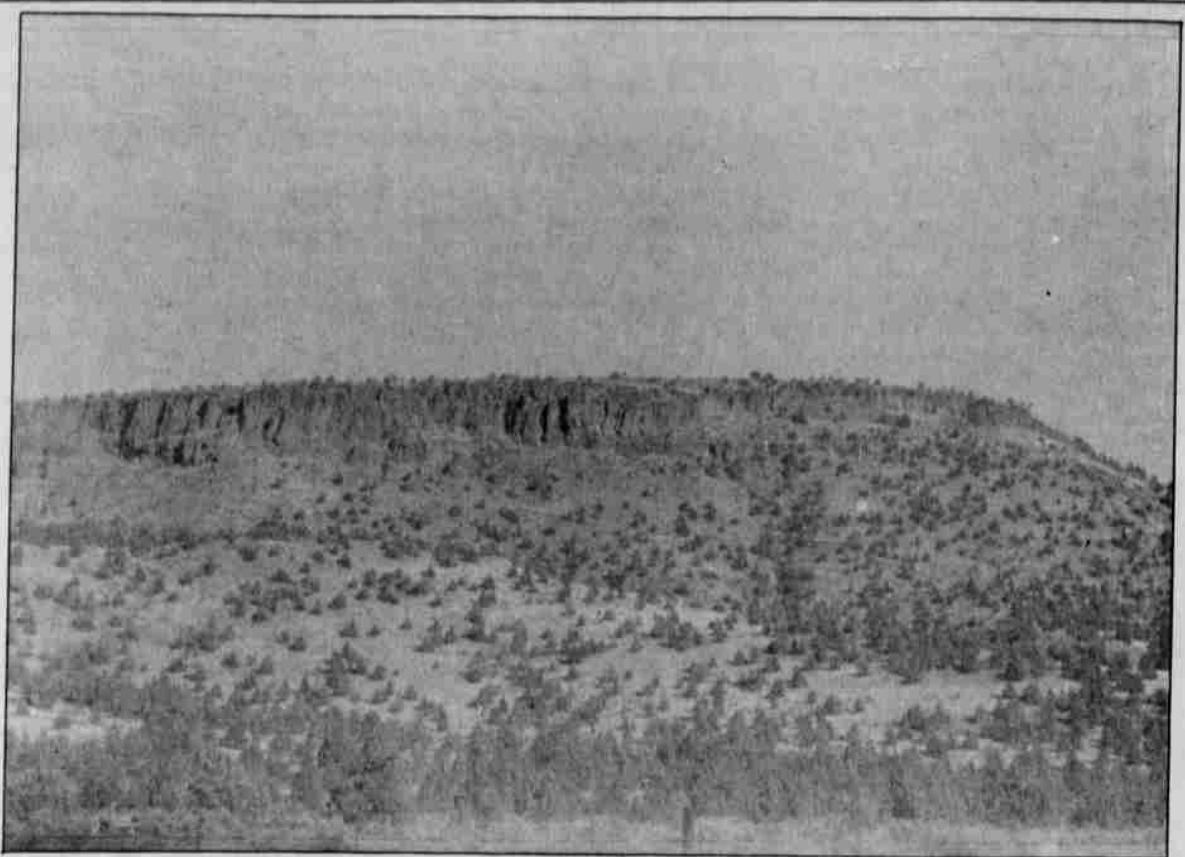

She was also a ceremonial leader she officiated at many funerals, ceremonial marriages and performed baptisms as a minister of the Shaker Religion.

Dressing ceremonies took place at Bel-Air Funeral home Monday, March 21, 1994. Overnight services followed at the Warm Springs Shaker Church. Burial was on Tuesday,

March 22, 1994 at sunrise at the Wolfe Point Cemetery. Pat Tanewasha officiated. Survivors include four (4) daughters, Iva Pennington, Inez McKinley and Joyce Surface of Warm Springs and Madeline Baker of Seattle, 20 grandchildren, 20 great-grandchildren and numerous nieces and nephews from Washington and Oregon.

She is preceded in death by her husband Clarence in 1983, Leroy McKinley 1937, Iva McKinley 1934, Infant McKinley 1936, Vera McKinley Gilbert 1973, Clarence McKinley, Jr. 1941, Robert C. You are hereby notified: That the above cited case(s), as filed in the Warm Springs Tribal Court, has been scheduled for trial/hearing at 2:00 p.m. on the 18th day of April, 1994.

You are hereby ordered: To be and appear at the Warm Springs Tribal Court at the time and date shown to defend against the charge(s). You may be represented by yourself, by an attorney, or by a spokesman, at your own expense. You may bring any documents you believe are relevant to this cause, and you may bring witnesses to testify on your behalf. You may request the Court to subpoena your witnesses, however, you must submit your list of witnesses no later than two weeks prior to trial; failure to do so will not be considered sufficient reason to postpone the trial. If you have any questions, you should seek legal advice immediately.

If you fail to appear as so ordered, the tribal court may enter a complaint for contempt of court and issue a warrant for your arrest.
