Bufs three runs short of victory

The Madras White Buffaloes Softball team fell short two runs in the Quarter Finals June 1 at Madras High School. The Dalles Indians defeated the Buffaloes 4-2 to move on toward the Class 3A softball Championships which will be held at Wallace Marine Park in Salem, Oregon.

The Dalles scored two runs in the third inning putting them ahead 2-0. In the fifth and sixth inning they scored one run in each to put them ahead 4-0.

Coming into the bottom of the seventh the Buffaloes had one last chance to pull it off, but fell short as only two runs came in before the third out was made.

Sophomore, Karissa Way of The Dalles struck out the Bufs seven times, to help her team to victory.

Madras finished their season with fifteen wins and ten losses.
