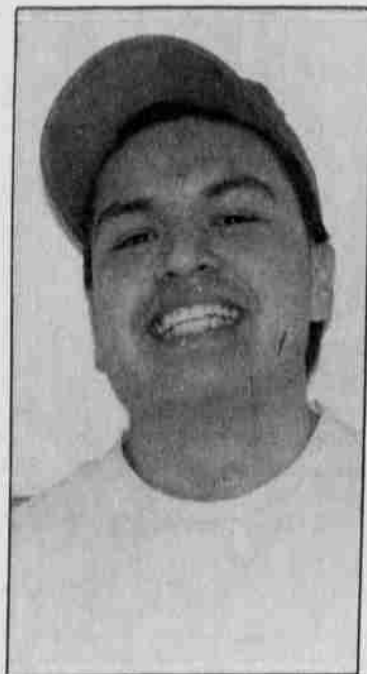

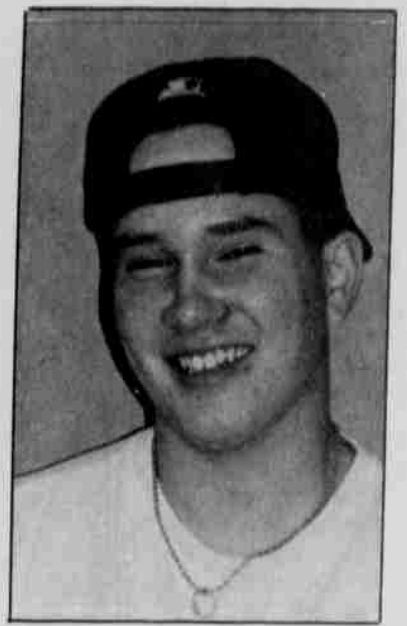

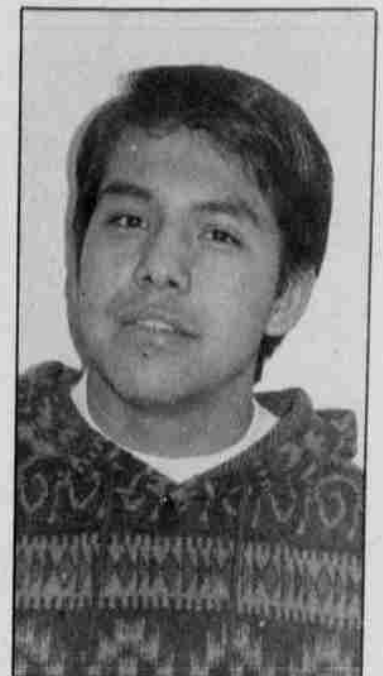

Halliday receives BA degree

John Halliday, 29, recently received a Bachelor of Arts degree in political science with emphasis in public administration from the University of Montana. Graduation ceremonies were held May 14 in Missoula. He has also been accepted into the Juris prudence doctorate and masters in public administration dual degree program as well.

Halliday was selected by the dean of the college as an "outstanding" student for academic achievement—he had a 3.45 cumulative gpa for his years in college and carried a 3.91 gpa for fall semester and a 3.85 gpa for spring semester.

Halliday also received a personal achievement award for outstanding academics and campus citizenship. As a student, Halliday was a member of the American Indian Business Leaders Association, the Kyi/yo Indian Club and a member of AISES, the American Indian Science and Engineering Society. He was a guest lecturer at the American Indian Law and Policy conference and was chosen to participate in the Harvard-sponsored Native American Executive Leadership Conference last November at the University of Montana

which offered analysis of political institutions for sustainable economic development.

When not a student himself, Halliday teaches Native American Culture for the Missoula school district through the Title V program.

Halliday is the son of Jeanne Thomas and the grandson of Frenchy Thomas. He has three children. He has two brothers; James works at Warm Springs Clothing as a salesman and Jeff is director of Fish and Wildlife for the Puyallip tribe in Washington.

Halliday spent over five years as a patrolman with the Warm Springs Police Department. His hobbies include playing Internet Around the World through his computer as well as reading, jogging and western and Indian dancing.

Halliday, a non-tribal member, has financed his education through scholarships obtained through a vigorous letter-writing campaign.
