Special events include: Century team roping, entry fee \$50.00, \$150.00 added: The wildhorse race, entry fee \$150.00, per team, added \$150.00, one go in the special events.

All entries pay a \$10.00 contestant fee. Barrel Racers pay a \$1.00 electric eye fee. This is a duel sanctioned rodeo with the Western States All-Indian Rodeo Association and the Rocky Mountain Indian Rodeo Association.
