The Hornets had to get their act together or be upset by a non ranked team from the pre-season polls. The Buffs jumped out early in the game and held onto a little lead at the intermission. The Hornets started to make their move in the third quarter slowly creeping and chopping away at the Buff lead and finally near the end of the fourth quarter the Hornets were able to take the lead away from the Buffs and never relinquished it again and held on to win the game.

The Buffs took charge of the game right from the start containing the bigger Henley Hornets most of the game. At the end of the first quarter the Buffs were out in front 17-10 and out scored

henley 23-19 in the second period to lead 42-27 at the half time mark.

It was just a great effort on the Madras White Buffaloes who faced the No. 3, rated team in the state according to the pre-season polls. A key factor was holding Henleys big Peoples to only three points in the entire game, where usually he is one of the big point producers for the team.
