Series of rodeos scheduled

A series of open Jackpot Rodeos will be held in Beatty, Oregon, with the first one being held May 20 and 21, 1995. There will be four in all during the summer. The second show will be June 10, 11, 1995, and on July 15, 16th and the final one August 19, 20, 1995. The events will include saddle bronc, entry fee \$27.50; bareback riding \$27.50; wildhorse race (per man \$82.50); calf roping \$27.50; wild cow milking \$27.50; team roping (per man \$27.50 go twice); barrel racing, \$27.50 bull riding (limited) with \$10.00 fee,

entry fee \$40.00; breakaway roping \$27.50; Jr. barrel racing \$15.00; Jr. bull riding, \$15.00; and peewee calf riding free. At the final rodeo belt buckles will be given to the one who builds up the most points during the series of shows. A person must have participated in seven of eight rodeos to qualify for the series buckle. Rodeo stock contractor is the Flying A Rodeo Inc. Stock Contractors. Annual Endurance Race

The Annual Endurance horse race is scheduled for Saturday, June 24, 1995, starting at 9:00 a.m. The starting place is at the Shaker Church, and ends there also. The race covers about 14 miles and the times are being cut down each year as the riders and horses cover the route faster. There is also a Junior Endurance race that covers five miles, which also starts and ends at the Shaker Church. Both races finish as the riders come down the steep hill west of the Agency area. There are different categories, one for the older men, the women and junior boys and junior girls. There will be prize money and many gifts awarded to the winners of each category. Be sure to turn out to see the annual endurance race.
