Men drown in Sincerely, Warm Springs River

On May 24, 1995 a missing person report was received by the Warm Springs Police Department from Lillian Watah of Klamath Falls, Oregon concerning her son James Wilson Watah and his friend Wayne Jay Nino. The pair had not returned to the Klamath Reservation from Warm Springs as anticipated.

On Friday, May 26, 1995 a vehicle was located upside down in the Warm Springs River on Highway. 8 near mile post 6.5 on the Warm Springs Reservation. An investigation was conducted and it is believed that the car drove off of the highway into the Warm Springs River. There was no evidence found to indicate that any foul play occurred, but there was evidence of alcohol found in the vehicle.

An Autopsy was conducted on both James W. Watah and Wayne J. Nino on Saturday, May 27, 1995 by Karen Gunson. Stated cause of death was "affixation by drowning."
