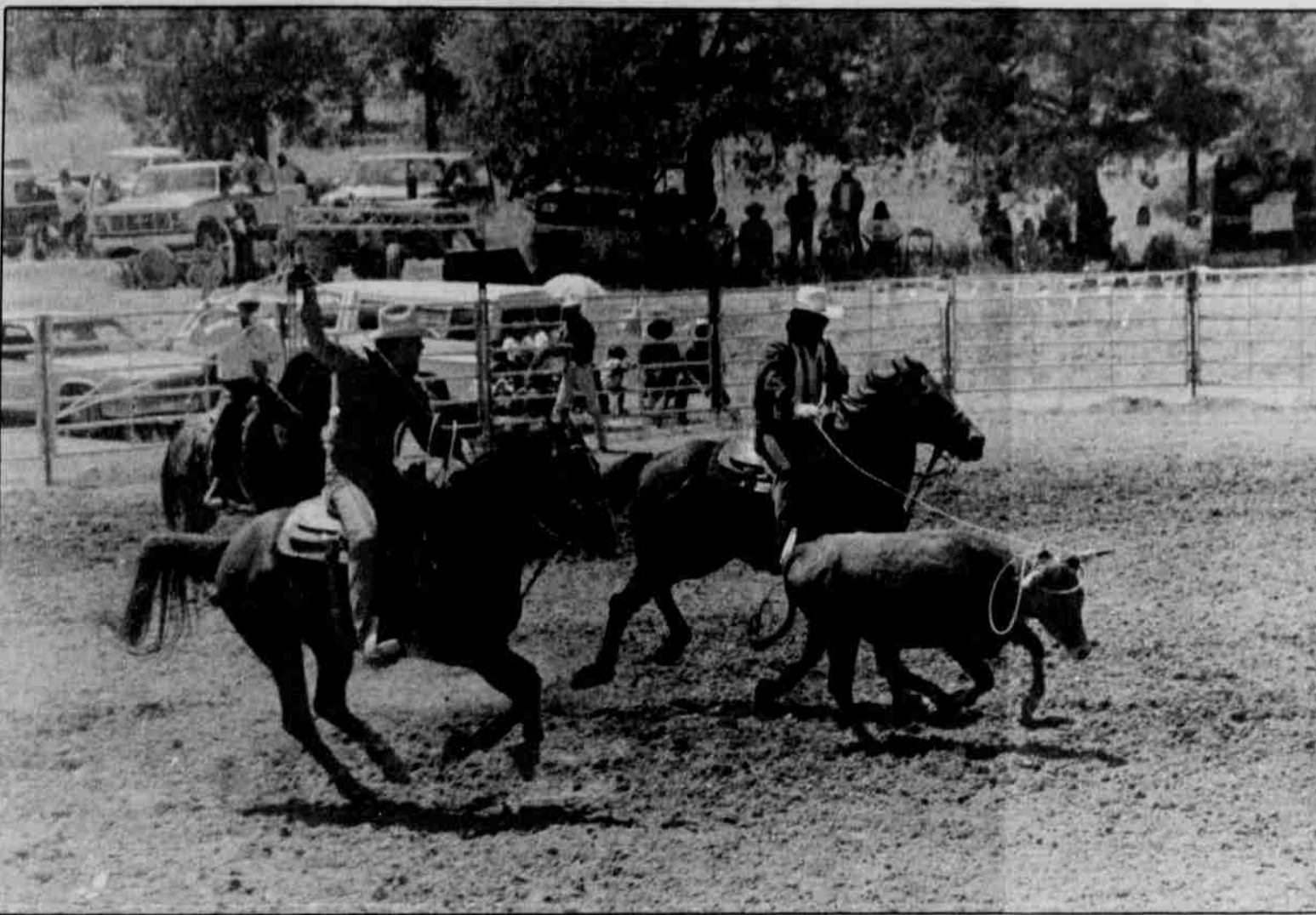


Rip roarin' Pi-Ume-Sha rodeo stirs up plenty of action

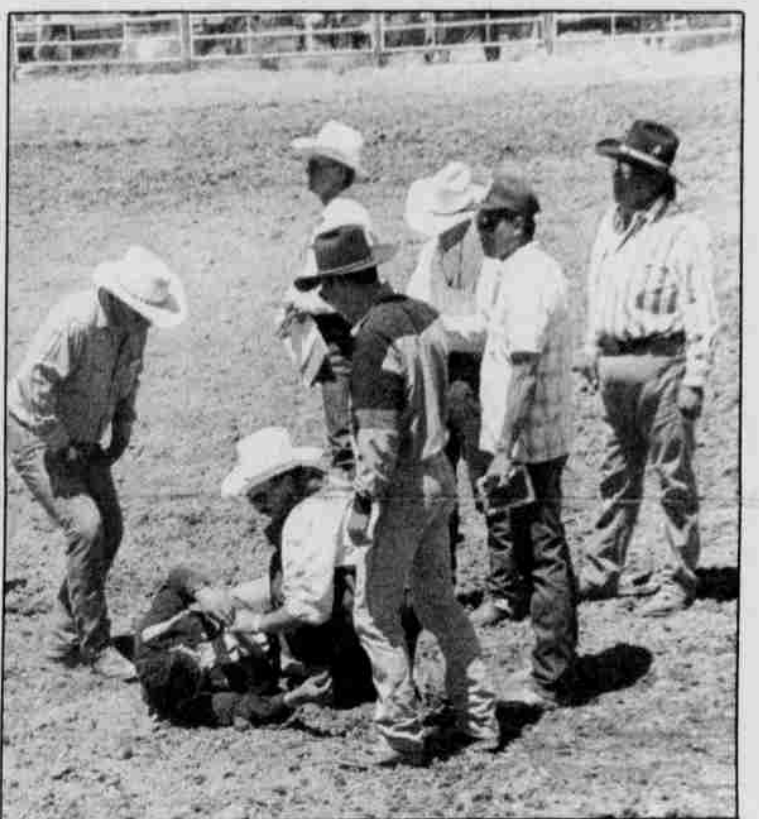

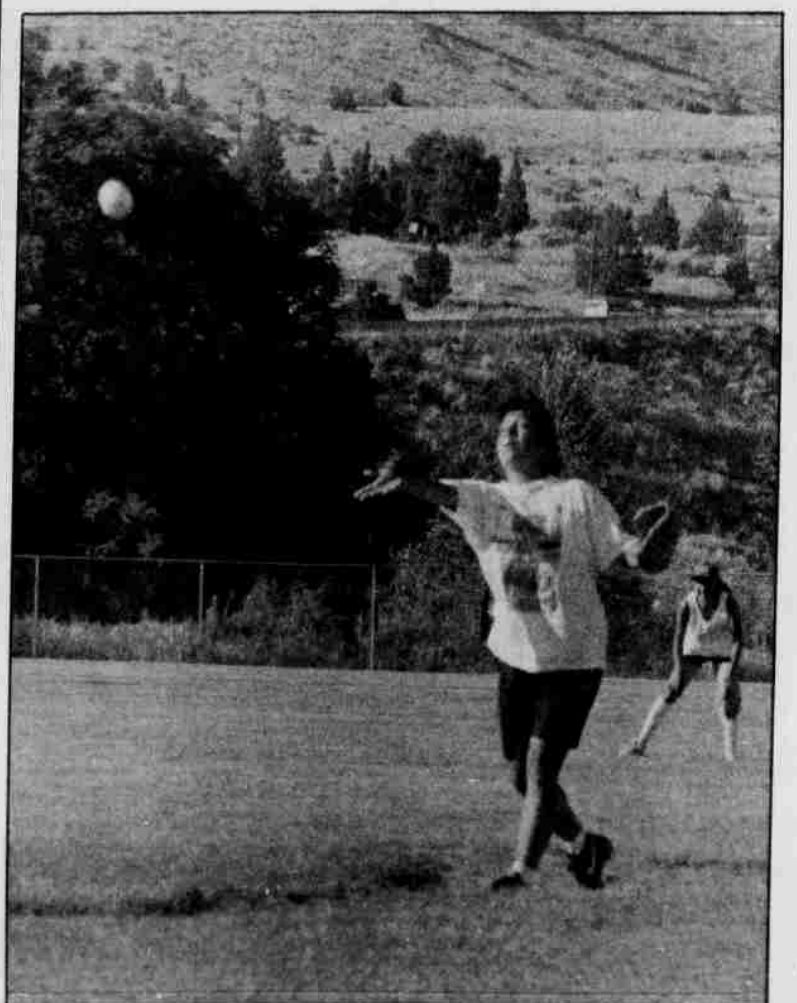
