In the girls division it was Bend high's Allison Cowart who won the race with a time of 19 minutes 17.84 seconds. Her time broke an old record which was 19:45. Things were really rolling at the Madras invitational meet. Lisa Flora of Myrtle Point was second with a time of 19:30.73. Third went to Kim Ball of Crook County, her time was 19:37.30 for third place.

The Bend area was dominant at the Madras invitational as the Cougars of Mt. View placed second to the Lava Bears. The Cougars scored 64 points. Crook County third with 135, Rainier fourth with 151 points; St Helens score was 183; Hood River Valley 174; Redmond 216; Myrtle Point 249; The Dalles Indians 280; Wahtonka Eagles

499; and Estacada Rangers 502.

In the boys division Zach Kerns crossed the finish line with a time of 16:22.24 to win the race. The Lava Bears took first place in the meet. Jesse Thomas of Mt. View was second, his time 16:30.69. The host Madras boys were a little under handed team wise with Ray Anderson turning in a time of 19:32 as he was the No. 57th in a field of 300 eger runners. Anderson was the best runner for the day.
