Buffaloes attempt comeback, but fall short as Sherwood Bowmen get league win

The White Buffaloes put up a real tussle in this game dispite the final score. There were some mistakes made that costed the Buffs a couple of TD's, that were called back. The Buffs second score was a crowd pleaser as QB Miller hit T.J. Foltz on a semi swing pass and he went the rest of the way zig zagging down the sideline for a 68 yard TD. The PAT failed as the pass fell incomplete, but things were looking

up for the Buffs trailing 28-14. But the game was far from over as the Sherwood Bowmen came storming back as broke loose on a 38 yard run with the kick good stretched the lead. one of their big guns Preston Scott broke loose on a 65 yard scamper for the TD, with another kick built their lead further out of reach.

The Buffs not giving up by any means scored again as QB Miller hit Kirsch on a 17 yard TD Pass. And a pass to Scott Riddle for two points.

This was one of the better games by the Buffs dispite the big score during the game. Just a couple of bad breaks for the Buffs kept them out of the game. Their next game is against league leading and state rated LaSalle on their home filed.
