Handgun fired

On October 31, 1995 at about 12:30 p.m. officers of the Madras Police department responded to a fight involving several juveniles at the intersection of 8th and Buff in Madras. The investigation revealed that during the altercation one shot from a small caliber handgun was fired. No injuries were sustained from the gun shot however a pickup truck in the area of the fight was struck causing minor damage. It was reported that bats were also used in the altercation.

Minor injuries were sustained as a result of being struck by the bats. No medical attention was required. Three male juveniles were taken into custody. One of the suspects was transported to the Juvenile Detention Center in Bend. Charges with menacing, unlawful possession of a firearm and carrying a concealed weapon. The other two suspects were released to parents.

The incident does not appear to be gang related at this time. The investigation is continuing and additional arrests are anticipated.
