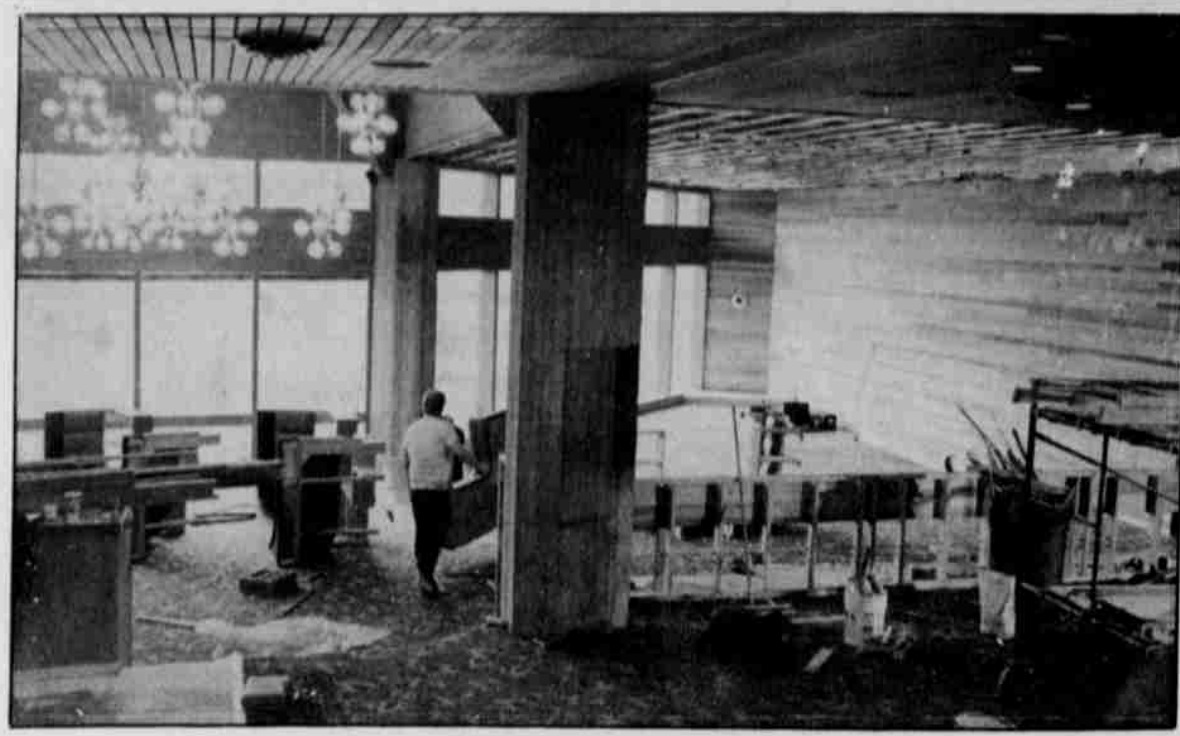

Purpose: To provide employment opportunities for treaty tribal enrollees living on/near Columbia River Zone 6, and who have demonstrated that treaty fishing has and will be a primary source of livelihood. Qualified enrolled members of the Nez Perce, Umatilla, Warm Springs and Yakama tribes have preference in hiring.

Location: Bonneville, Cascade Locks, Underwood and Lone Pine sites.

Phase 1 of this project will last about one year. Davis-Bacon wages are in effect. This is a drug-free project. Construction consists primarily of making the sites more accessible through asphalt paving, restrooms, boat launch, etc. Portions of the project will be subcontracted.

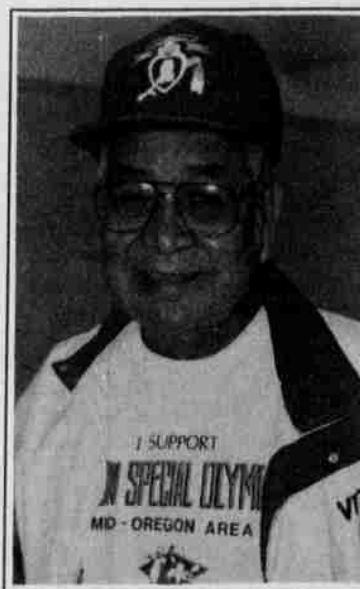
Phase 2 is slated to begin in 1997, of up to 30 more access sites. This construction is contingent upon Congressional approval.
