### **Oregon Athletics Holds Off** Lapwai for Championship

The Oregon Athletics team of Pendleton, Oregon, topped the field of twelve teams who participated in this years Warm Springs Holiday All Indian Basketball tournament. The Athletics outlasted the Lapwai, Idaho team to win the championship by the score of 113-108

The twelve team tournament turned out to be a rip-snorter with teams from Washington, Idaho, Nevada, California and Oregon, all out to win the championship, but after all the elimination's it came down to the Oregon Athletics and the Lapwai, Idaho team vieing for the championship. Santa Clara, California won third place and the Warm Springs Magpies placed fourth.

In the game for all the marbles it was between Lapwai, Idaho and the Oregon Athletics of the Umatilla Reservation. The two teams were pretty evenly matched. The Idaho team had a slight edge height wise but the heads up play of the Oregon Athletics brought

them the Championship.
