In addition to its life-saving missions aboard the Bell 222 helicopter and Cessna fixed-wing aircraft, Air Life contributes to community education as well. Child care seat safety clinics have been extremely successful in various communities, and the flight team also takes time to train groups in preparing patients for air transport.
