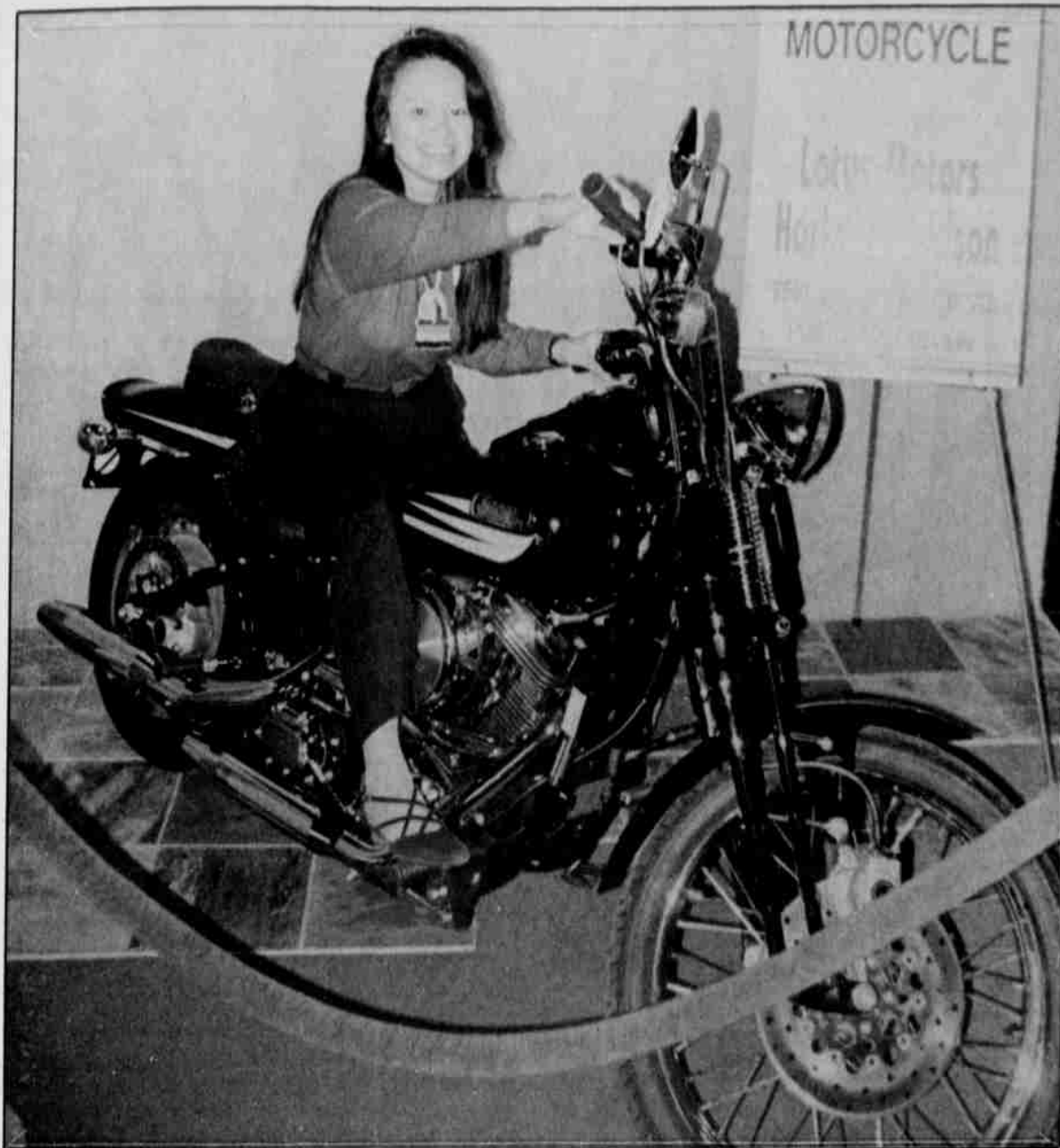

You are hereby notified that a petition for Civil Complaint has been filed with the Warm Springs Tribal Court alleging the Defendant has committed a civil wrong against the Plaintiff.

By this notice you are summoned to appear at a hearing scheduled for 4 p.m. on the 13th day of May, 1996, at the Warm Springs Tribal Court. All of the facts of the case will be heard at this hearing, including evidence you wish to present.

The Defendant in this matter has the right to file an answer to the complaint prior to the hearing, however, he/she is not required to do so. The Defendant also has the right to file a counterclaim prior to the hearing. Any papers filed with this court in conjunction with this case must be accompanied by a certification that the opposing party was served a copy of the same by the time the court filing was made.

If the defendant fails to appear at the hearing, the court may award the plaintiff a default judgment, which means the court can award the plaintiff all that is requested in the complaint. If the plaintiff fails to appear at the hearing, the court may dismiss the case for lack of prosecution, allow the defendant to offer proof, or continue the case and reschedule the hearing. If both parties fail to appear at the hearing, the court may dismiss the case with prejudice, or reschedule the hearing.

Both parties in this action may be represented by legal counsel, or may elect to represent themselves. Representation must be approved by the presiding judge to ensure the rules governing admissibility to practice are met; therefore, a spokesman form must be submitted for approval at least five working days prior to the hearing.

If you have any questions, you should seek legal advice immediately. Failure to obtain legal counsel prior to the hearing is not sufficient cause to reschedule the hearing.
