Cutler was honored as one of the many teachers who pulled together to see that children made it home safe during the flood in February. All the teachers rode buses with the children to their homes. They wanted to be sure their parents or someone was there waiting for them.

For many teachers this is the first time ever leaving the Campus area and going into the community. Teachers are now beginning to participate in community gatherings and activities to learn what the Warm Springs people are about. By doing this they feel they are getting a better understanding of where the children come from and what their environment is outside of school. The children's cultural upbringing makes a difference in their behavior at school. The community involvement helps the teachers understand that in the children.

Not only have the teachers come together during the flood but during the illness of Dawn Smith.

At the end of the year each teacher will be recognized for their commitment to the school and

children. A parent representative from each classroom is organizing fund raisers and taking donations from anyone who wants to help. They would like to present each teacher with a gift of appreciation.

The school will also have a fun day with races and other events for the children to participate in. There will be prizes for each event. The parent group is also taking donations for prizes for the children's fun day.

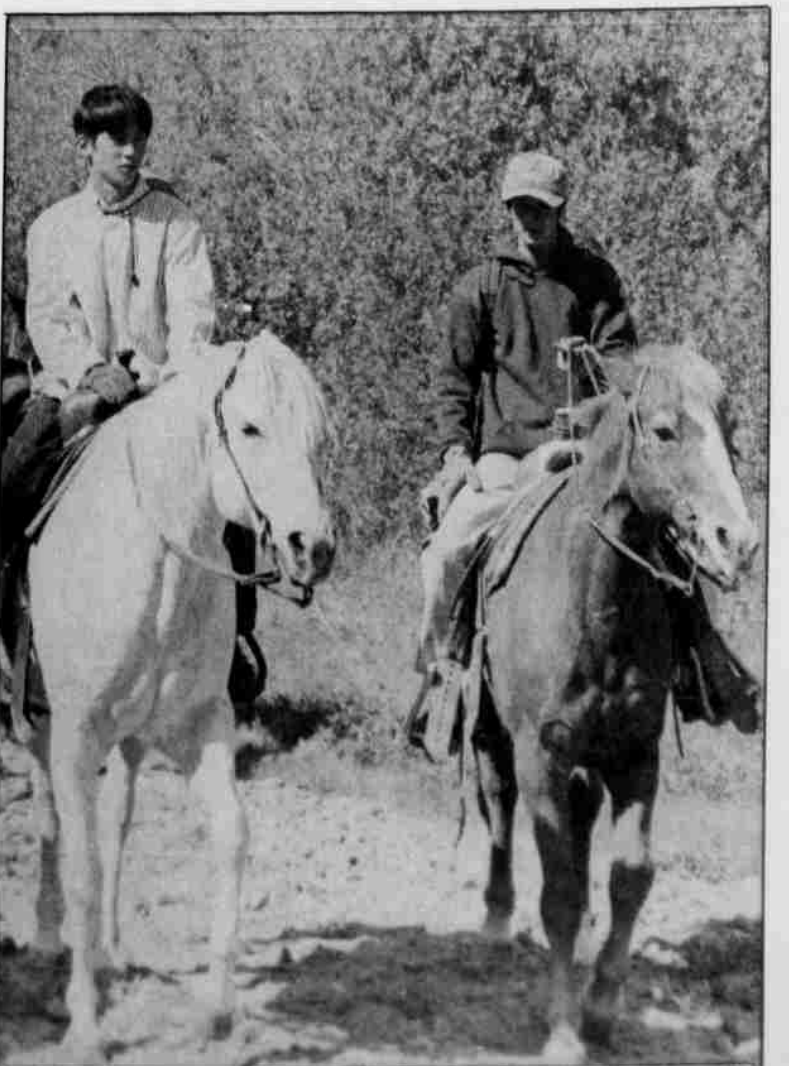
