## Roll-over accident claims member

On Sunday, May 26, 1996 at 1:49 p.m., Warm Springs police officers responded to a reported roll-over motor vehicle accident on Hwy. 26 near Warm Springs Forest Products Industries.

The driver, and sole occupant of the 1988 Hyundai, Lily Ann Walker, was ejected from the vehicle. She was transported to Mt. View Hospital in Madras with severe head and chest injuries, by Fire & Safety. Walker was then airlifted to St. Charles Medical Center in Bend, where she later died.

The accident is still under investigation by Warm Springs Police department, reported Chief of Police Carmen Smith.

Tribal member Lilly Ann Walker, age 44, died May 26, 1996 at the St. Charles Medical Center in Bend, Oregon due to injuries from an automobile accident.

Walker was born September 13, 1951 to Oscar and Kathleen (Kalama) Moses in Warm Springs, OR where she resided until her death.

Lilly Ann graduated from Madras High School in 1969 then attended Eastern Oregon State University. She graduated from Oregon State University with B.S. degree in elementary education. She began her first teaching job in 1975 as a first grade teacher in Madras. Walker was one of the few Warm Springs Tribal members to teach in the 509-J School District. She also was the director of the Student Work Program, Director of the Summer Program, Student Education Counselor, Head Teacher, Latch-Key Program and at the time of her death, she was the Career Counselor for the Tribal Education Department.

She enjoyed playing softball, basketball, making hand crafted Sally bags, watching her sons participate in sports and supporting educational opportunities for tribal members.

Survivors include her sons Scott Carlson Moses, Jake Oscar Suppah and Chasan Ray Walker all of Warm Springs, mother Kathleen Moses of Warm Springs, sisters JoAnn Moses of Warm Springs and Fran Moses-Ahern of Madras; brothers Victor, William, Joseph, George and Oliver Moses, and Todd Danzuka all of Warm Springs. Husband Gary Walker and numerous nieces and nephews.

She was preceded in death by her father, sister Patricia Moses and her grandparents Susan and William Moses and O.B. and Katie Kalama.

The dressing ceremony was held Wednesday, May 29, 1996 at 10 a.m. at the Bel-Air Colonial Chapel. Overnight services followed at the Warm Springs Baptist Church. Burial was Thursday, May 30, 1996 at the Kalama Cemetery.
