Warriors win Yreka tourney

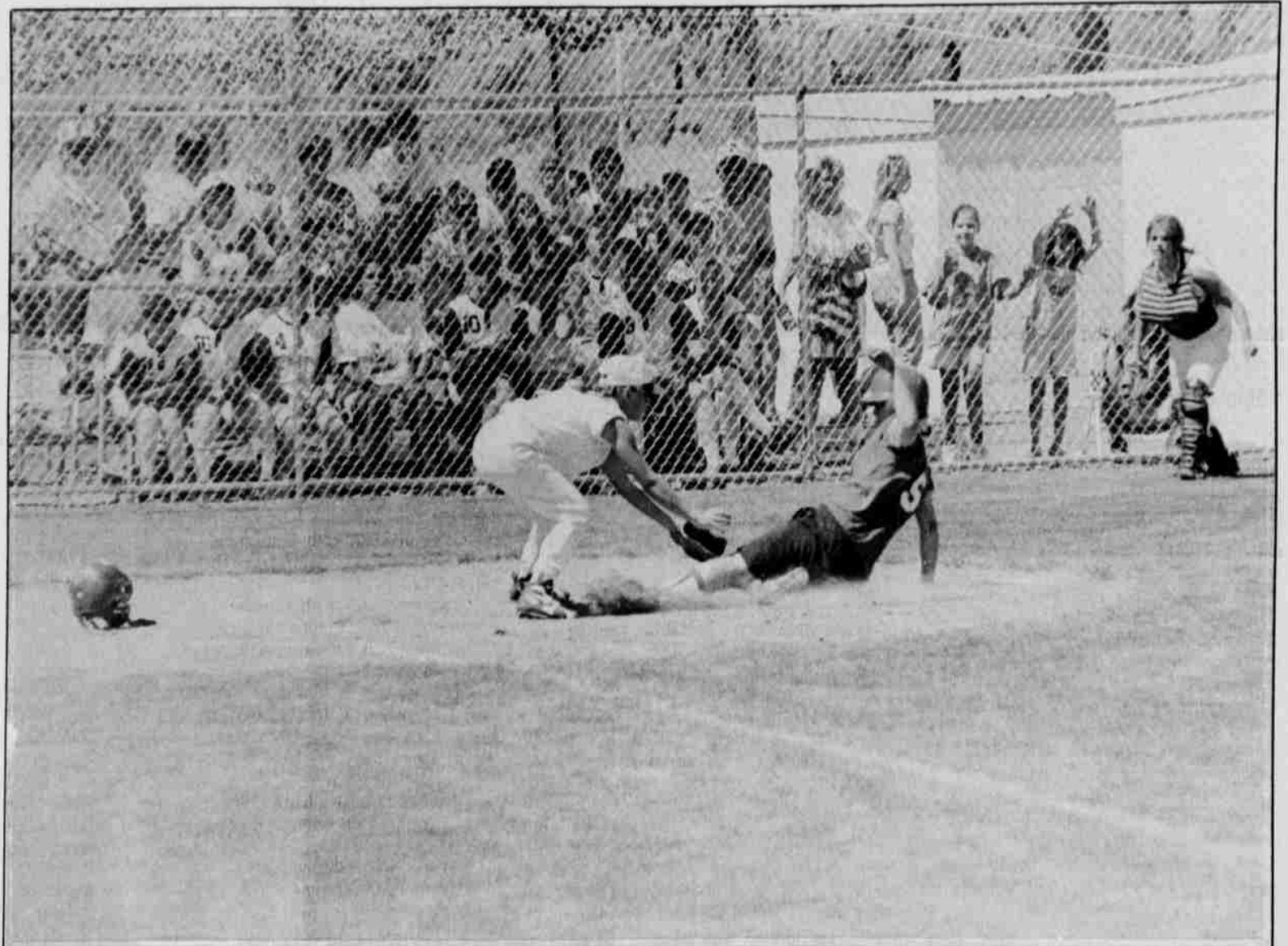
