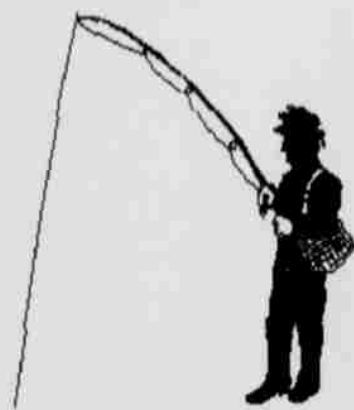

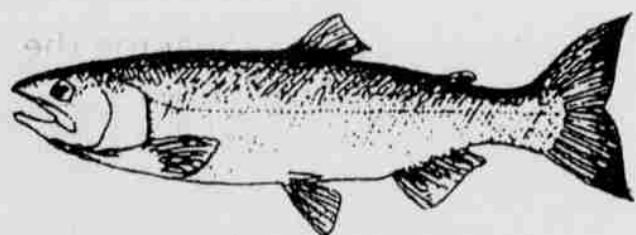
Awamo'a	morning

U nanumu eka pakwe hanekuo. Give your relatives the fish.

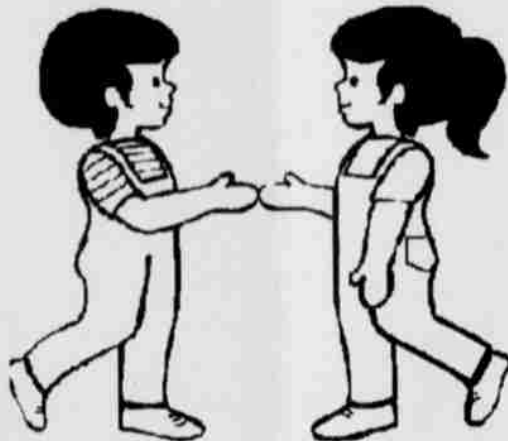
Sa'a u poonedua. See you later.

Moasu unu udzutsumennu. It's getting pretty chilly/cold.

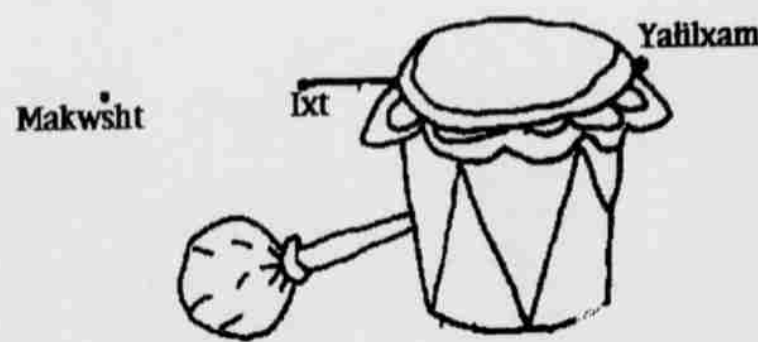
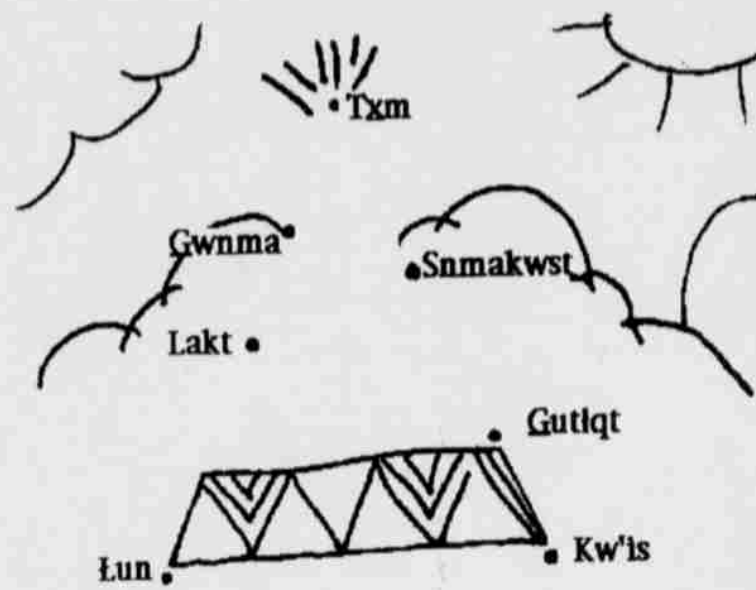
Ewow koona hanese mikoo pedakwe. Get lots of wood and build fire!

Kiksht Puzzles



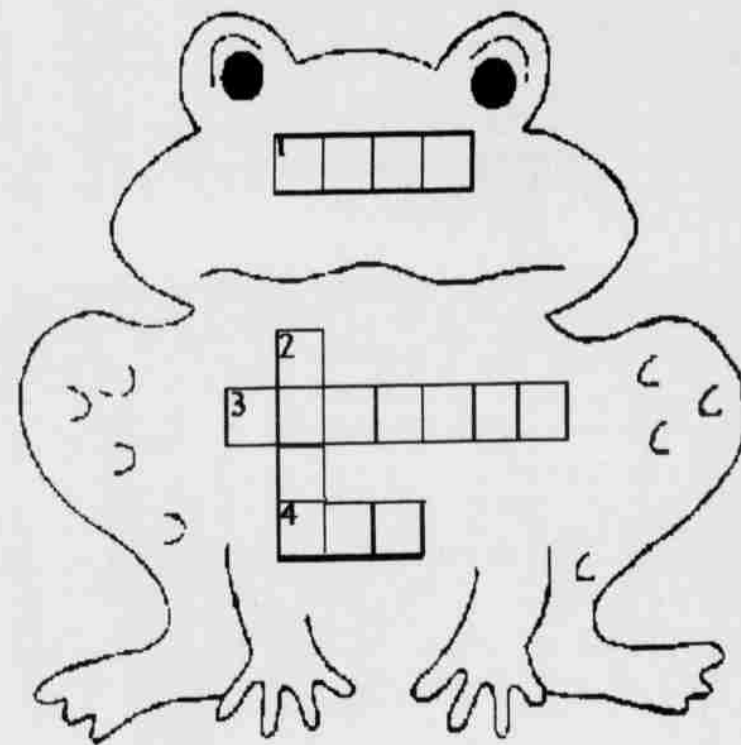
Kiksht Numbers Crossword
