Buyers gathered to check their eyes, teeth and private parts. Their muscles body strengths and weaknesses. The ladies were child bearing and had hard labor. The men for muscle strength to endure hardships and hard work.

Myself, I feel we subjected our own flesh and blood to this humiliation. We stood them up in front of the people. They had to show themselves. Speak about their past blood line. When we cannot take our blood out of them that were not adopted. We shamed our ancestors that established good things for us. We can't stop loving and looking at our children that didn't get adopted. Where do our hearts lie? We have adopted too many white man ways. I'm really hurt and dissatisfied that my 3 grandchildren and others were left behind. I other words thrown away.
