Katie Christensen scored 11 and Suppah had nine to lead the Buffs in scoring. Everyone scored for the Lady Buffs in the game. Coach John Peterson stated, "We had an advantage in scoring off turnovers."

Madras played McKay in their last game, winning by a score of 44-32. Madras opened the first quarter fast and outscored McKay 16-4.

Madras never gave up the lead they built in the first quarter and won the game by 12 points.

"Our defense clogged up the middle and we rebounded very well, with everyone contributing something to make this a total team effort," stated coach Peterson.

The Lady Buffs will travel to Valley Catholic on January 7, to resume league play.

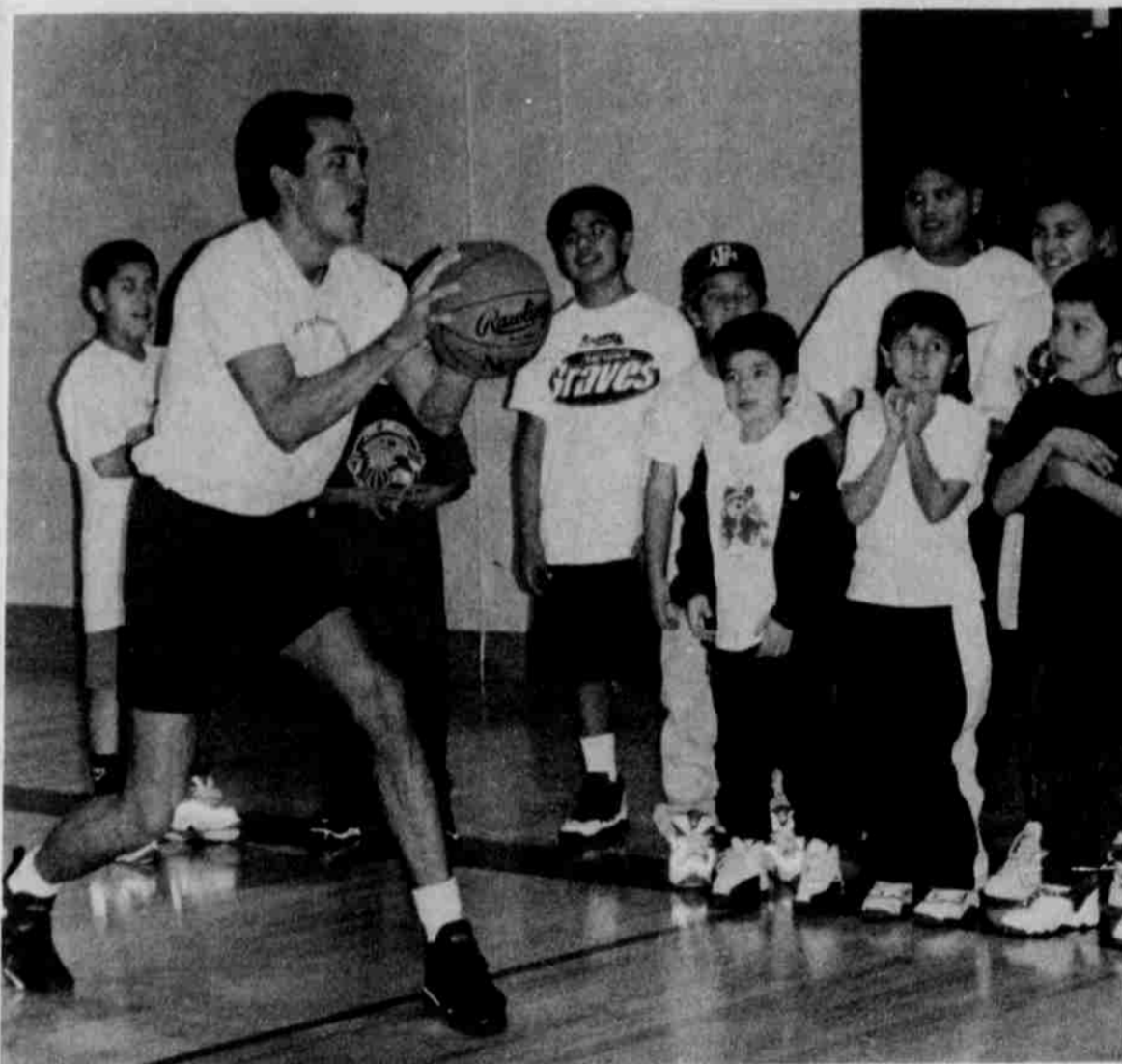
In the second the Falcons outscored the Buffs 14-9 to lead Madras 27-23, which prove to be the turning point of the game because they played even basketball the rest of the way.

In the third Madras scored 13 to LaSalle's 14 and in the fourth both teams scored 14 point's.

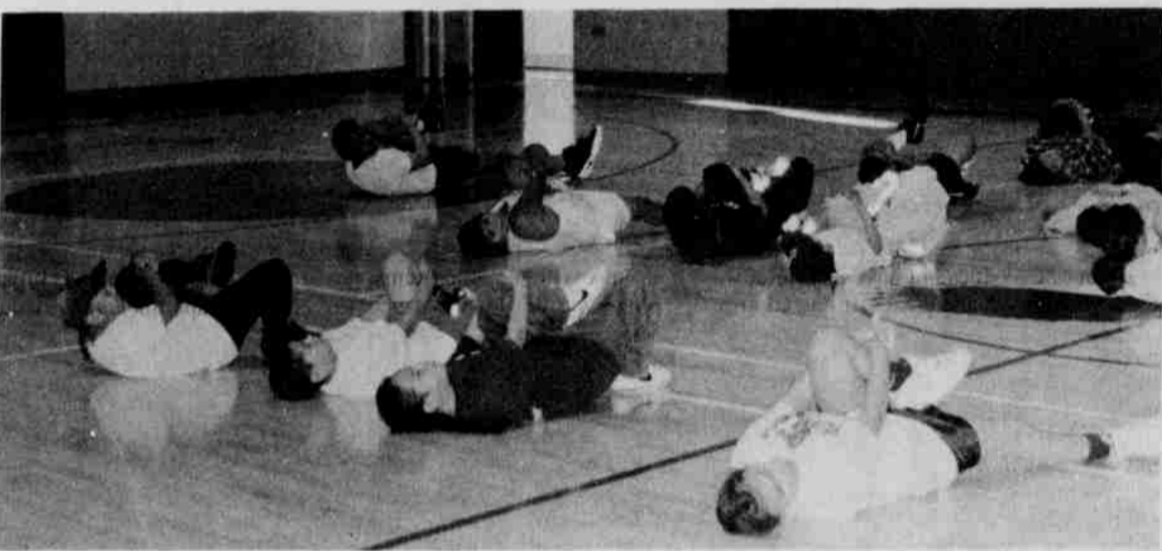

Monty Larson teaches children to pass the ball to their teammates.



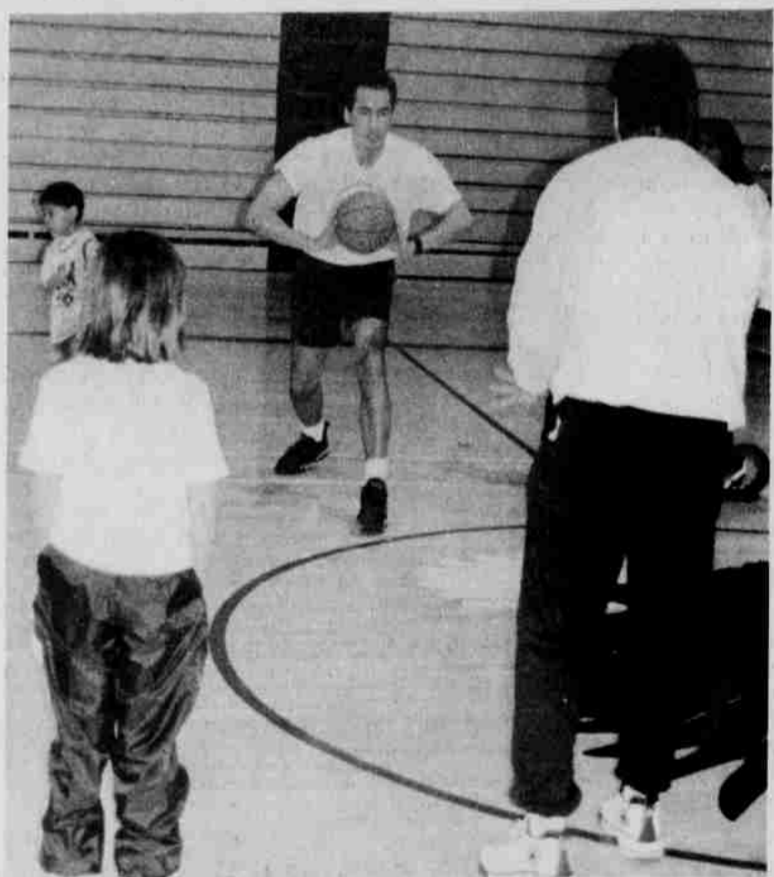
Children stretch their leg muscles before playing basketball.

on the night to lead all scorers. Madras was lead by Gregg's 13 points. Suppah had ten points, while Hawes pitched in eight.

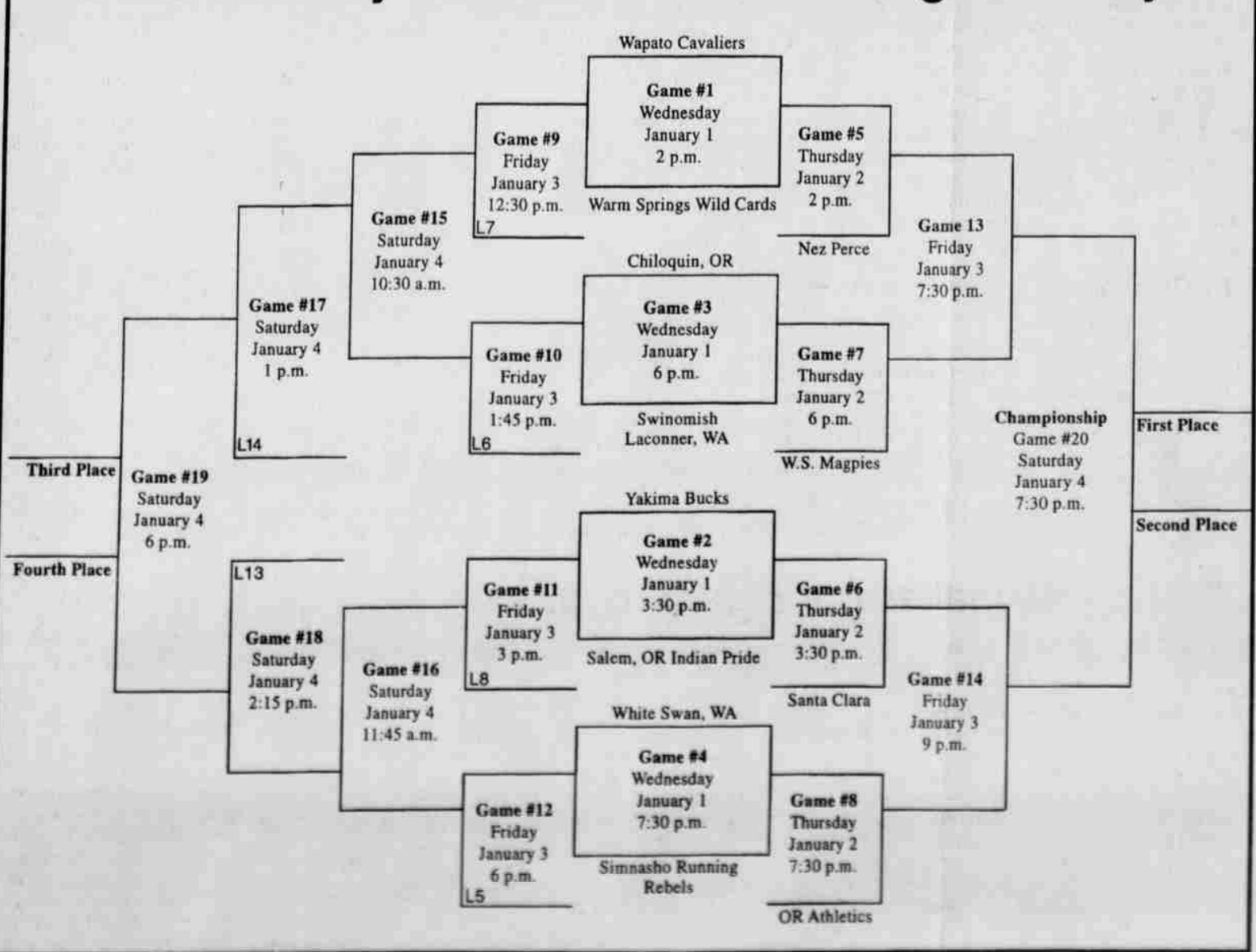
Travelers to host 40 & over

Madras Boys Take Third place at Seaside
