responding to a debris burn at your house," says Tias.
"We have started the rural housing assessments during the month of April and some of you are wondering how safe you and your family would be in a fire situation. Brochures and suggestions are being left with home owners on how to make your home or property more fire safe, says Tias. "A big step in fire prevention is education," says Tias. We all need to learn how and what we must do to prevent fire from starting or spreading.
"If some are planning to have Fire Management do the burning for you, remember the order of priority, all senior citizens first; the disabled second; and single mothers with small children are third. "All debris must first be cleared away from all the structures and vehicles," reminds Tias.

The Indian Warrior, The Veterans Corner V F W Elects Officers.

During the Veterans meeting on April 22, 1997, there were elections of officers for the coming year. A discussion among all those who were present and it was decided to retain the present officers for another year. So a motion was made and a second to the motion, all in favor motion carried. The Wall that Heals coming to Prineville

The Vietnam Veterans Memorial wall will visit Prineville, Oregon May 15 to the 18th, 1997.
"The Wall that Heals", is a half scale replica-stretching nearly 250 feet in total length as well as the original Vietnam Veterans Memorial in Washington D.C. It travels across the nation speaking of the lives of 58,202 men and women who lost their lives in Vietnam.
The Wall will be set up in the Ochoco Creek Park and will be on display 24 hours a day. On Thursday, the 15th there will be an opening service at the Wall at 11 a.m. And on Saturday there will be a Memorial service at the Wall starting at 1:00 p.m. and static military displays.

Prineville will be the twentieth stop, marking the half-way point, of the forty city national tour. Prineville will host the first west coast appearance of the Traveling Vietnam Veterans Memorial which made it's first public appearance at Charleston, N.C. in November 1996.
This official replica was designed and built by the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Fund, the organization that built and preserves the Wall in Washington, promoted nationally by the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States and Turner Network Television, and locally by More Country KRCO/ KIJK/KTWI, Crestview Cable of Prineville, Chambers Cable of Sun River,

Bend Cable, and Falcon Cable of Redmond.
The exhibition in Prineville has been made possible through the efforts of the Memorial Day Committee with the assistance and support of local Veterans, Fraternal, and Civic organizations, local business and citizens of Prineville and Crook County.
"The Wall That Heals" will be open 24 hours a day, beginning at 11:00 a.m. on May 15th. There is no charge for admission to the exhibit.
