is \$2.79 per bushel for grade number 1.
• The loan matures on demand; but no later than the last day of the ninth month following the month the loan is approved.
• The interest rate for August is 6.625 percent per annum.
• For warehouse stored loans, the grain must be stored in an approved facility and in Jefferson County only Cenex Supply qualifies.
• For farm stored loans, the bins must also have ladders attached to the outside of the bins and also on the inside of partially filled bins.
• The loan service fee is the smaller

of \$45.00 or 1/2 of 1 percent times the gross loan amount plus \$3.00 for each bin or warehouse receipt over one.
• The deadline to apply is March 31, 1998.
Agriculture loans
Funds are available to eligible agricultural producers for farm operating loans, farm ownership loans, beginning farmer loans and emergency loans.

Medicaid Available for the Veterans



Questions veterans have: Are Veterans eligible for Medicaid? Will my family suffer if I use Medicaid? How do I apply?
Veterans are eligible for Medicaid whenever their medical expenses exceed their ability to pay...just as any other citizen who meets State criteria. Here is some information where Medicaid can help.
Veterans at the Portland VA Medical Center often find themselves needing nursing home care. The VA can often help with this expense for the first two months, but after that time the responsibility for payment is the Veteran's. If the veteran cannot pay the \$2000 or more that nursing home care can cost, she or he may be eligible for money from Medicaid to pay what the patient cannot.

In Oregon State, the law is similar, but the amount a spouse can keep is up to \$815.00 a month of both partners' income.

HOW CAN I APPLY FOR MEDICAID?

There are several ways to apply for Medicaid.

In Washington State, go to the Department of Social and Health services to pick up an application. There is a face sheet: fill it out at the office and give it to the receptionist. An appointment will be made for you to see a worker to help you fill out the application. If eligible, your benefits will begin the day you filled out the face sheet.
When you meet with the Medicaid worker, be sure to have information proving amount of family income and medical expenses.

MUST MY FAMILY BE IMPOVERISHED FOR ME TO RECEIVE MEDICAID?

Happily, the Congress has recently passed a bill to relieve families of the necessity to be impoverished in order to receive financial help while a member is in a nursing home.

In Washington State, a spouse remaining at home can receive up to \$1000 of both partners' income, as well as keep up to \$60,000 in savings, trusts, assets, etc. One house, one car, personal belongings, jewelry, etc., are not counted in the \$60,000. An allowance for housing expenses (taxes, utilities, and other expenses to stay in our current home) is also

When you meet with the Medicaid worker, be sure to have information proving amount of family income and medical expenses.

In Oregon, you can apply for Medicaid at your local Aging Services office. If you are over 65 or Disabled, Visit the Adult and Family Service office in your area if you are younger than 65, or if you are not rated as disabled by Social Security.

Medicaid can help any person who is threatened financially, without impoverishing their families!
