Indians subject to discrimination

"For years Columbia river salmon and steelhead have been managed in a way that has discriminated against Indian fishers. The listing of upper Columbia Basin steelhead as endangered and Snake River steelhead as threatened is one more event in a series that stretches back at least on hundred years which could deprive tribes of their inherent, sovereign, treaty reserved fishing rights," said Ted Strong, Executive director of the Columbia River Inter-Tribal Fish Commission.

Strong pointed out that if management actions resorted naturally spawning populations to healthy levels then both Indians and non-Indians could fish. The tribes support these of supplementation to help naturally spawning populations, restoration of natural river conditions by modifying dams, and protection as well as restoration of spawning and rearing habitat.

"Those who know intimately the las hundred years' history of the Columbia Basin salmon know that state and federal fishery management has been discriminatory against Indians," he added. The recently signed secretarial order calls for consultation between the National Marine Fisheries Service and tribes concerning Endangered Species Act listings such as this. There have been no such consultations.

Strong also pointed out the apparent double standard the federal agency used to determine which populations to list and which to defer or ignore. The State of Oregon challenged NMFS' data in the lower Columbia and on the Oregon coast and NMFS deferred the listing decision. CRITFC challenged the data in the Snake and upper Columbia and NMFS listed.

NMFS' actions will isolate steelhead populations that are already

declining in part because of their reproductive isolation. Instead of trying to re-connect these populations, NMFS puts up artificial barriers to keep them from interbreeding which they did before dams, logging, and other impacts fragmented them into isolated groups. NMFS views artificial propagation to keep these populations from going extinct only as a last resort. Given the role NMFS has played in developing hatcheries in the Snake River Basin, their turnabout on hatcheries leaves us wondering what NMFS will propose next that will diminish the tribes' treaty fishing.

"NMFS' approach to steelhead habitat degradation and dam-related mortalities will bring us one step closer to the violation of the solemn treaty promises of the United States government and to the abrogation of the trust responsibility every federal agency has to uphold those pledges."

You know, when I was out in the world, I have to say I did things I shouldn't have. For this I would like to say I'm sorry. I've been trying so hard to stay sober. I have been sober now, as of this letter, 797 days. I

thought by being sober this long, my family would be happy for me. Instead, I was told by the investigator that they have had a lot of bad things to say about me.

You know, when I have myself to the Lord about two months ago, even after being sober this long, a whole new world opened up for me. Now, because of this, my world is crumbling down. You know I walked with Satan for 22 years and now that I am on the other side, he does not like it. He will use any means he can to bring me down. I was told by my pastor that the hardest battles I will have are not out there, but within my own family.

I have been trying so hard to do good for myself. Not long ago, I got my driver's license, which I never had before. I have insurance for me and my car. I got tired of waiting for a job, so I made my own. I have a

little stand at Kah-Nee-Ta, for which I am very thankful.

I am also going to change my name, my first and my last. I know longer wish to be who I am. For myself, I wish I could just be let alone. When I was in treatment over two years ago, I told myself that I would be around my family more and enjoy being with them because I never was around them much. Instead, I was always drinking, you know I was a DRUNK. I embarrassed myself and my family. I lost all respect for myself. Nobody trusted me because I stole to have my drink. I wish these people I call my family would forgive me. If I have done anything to hurt you, this is not a suck-up for when I go to court; this is what I wanted to say.

Tribal members processing loan through tribal credit must provide loan certification when submitting bid. Opening date for submitting bids is 8-14-97. Closing date is 8-28-97.

1. 1966 Chev 1 ton flat bed fair condition \$500.00.
2. 1986 Ford LTD station wagon good condition \$750.00.
3. 1977 Dodge pickup good condition \$750.00.

These vehicles can be inspected at the tribal warehouse in the industrial park.

The following motors and transmissions are also open for bid.


