### Domiciliary Care For Homeless Veterans

Domiciliary Care for Homeless Veterans. (DCHV) Department of Veterans Affairs.

What is a Domiciliary?

Historically, the Domiciliary program is the oldest of the Department of Veterans Affairs health care programs. It was initiated through legislation passed in the late 1860's to provide a home for disabled volunteer soldiers of the Civil War.

The Portland Department of Veterans Affairs Domiciliary Care for Homeless Veterans (DCHV) serves Northwestern veterans, primarily homeless veterans, who can benefit from rehabilitative services.

This short term program gives veterans who are in need of housing, the opportunity to address unemployment, addiction recovery, basic living skills and homelessness which may have prevented them from living as independent life.

Goals:

The Department of Veterans Affairs Urban Domiciliary is a participatory and multi-disciplinary program whose primary goal is rehabilitation. The Domiciliary will focus on improving health, renewing of self-carre and social skills, upgrading academic and vocational abilities, and assisting in community placement. The intention of the Domiciliary program is to prepare the veteran to function at his/her optimal level of independence.

Objectives:

Provide temporary/transitional living space for veterans who need minimal physiological, sociological, and psychological services.

Provide minimal medical care, but furnish initial medical, and psychiatric evaluation and provide referral access to ancillary VA health services and other appropriate community health care services.

Criteria for Admission:

\*Veterans who are eligible for VA

benefits.

\*Homeless Veterans who are in need of a semi-structured environment in which to accomplish rehabilitation.

\*Veterans referred from an inpatient psychiatric facility must have pre-arranged outpatient treatment and continue in that treatment while in the Domiciliary. Referring services of agencies must submit a discharge summary prior to the veteran's admission. If applying from outside the VA Medical Center please mail discharge summaries to VA Medical Center (IL-DOM), P.O. Box 1035, Portland, Oregon 97207.

\*Veterans need to be able to care for themselves, maintain their own medications, do their own laundry, and keep appointments. Veterans must be able to perform routine activities of daily living.

\*Veterans must exhibit the following characteristics to gain admission:

—Motivation to participate in the Domiciliary programs.

—Willingness to adhere to Domiciliary rules and regulations.

—Ability to CO-exist in a semi-structured community setting.

—Willingness to maintain an alcohol/drug free environment.

\*Application for admission to the Domiciliary program will be made through the Domiciliary Social Worker or his assistant. Final review of application will take place in the Domiciliary Admission Screening Committee.

\*Veterans seeking admission to the program who are chemically addicted and who have been practicing their addiction at any time within the last 12 months must successfully complete an inpatient addiction treatment program prior to entry into the Domiciliary. Successful completion is determined by the Domiciliary Admission

Screening Committee.

Program.

The Domiciliary is part of the Portland Department of Veterans Affairs Medical Center located at the Vancouver, Washington Extension Care Division.

The Domiciliary serves the states of Oregon and Washington. The majority of clients are from the Portland, Oregon and Vancouver, Washington area. Intake interviews are conducted at local homeless shelters as well as at the Domiciliary.

the state of Washington.

In 1990, he returned to become the Nez Perce Tribe's natural resource manager. Now, he's tribal treasurer and helped acquire the first property the Nez Perce have owned in Oregon since Chief Joseph fled his homeland 120 years ago.

Tribal fortunes have risen with the onslaught of gambling, but Matheson and others see that as a steppingstone. Tribal gambling profits are being poured into education so that more young leaders will rise to the top.

"Gaming will only be a footnote in our history," Matheson predicted. "Some day, we may take a seat at the table of corporate America."
