# Veterans Forum held September 10-

A Veterans Forum was held in Warm Springs, Oregon, on September 10, 1997. This meeting was held to meet the Veterans here and let them know there are services available for them. Get out and meet the Veterans was one way to put it. Their pourpose of being here was to give insight about VA services and benefits that are available for the Veterans. They were also interested in hearing from the local veterans. For them to voice their concerns and questions of services for the veterans.

They were interested in finding out how the VA services and benefits can be provided to the veterans here. To get things underway their pourpose was introduced by Charmaine Kinney, VA medical Center. As it appears the Indian Veterans seem to be isolated out here on the reservation and are not really up to date on what's available for them at the VA Center. Many Veterans do no ask if things are there so this is one of the reasons for this veterans forum.

The VA Hospital is a New Plush Hospital setting on top of the hill along veterans street where the old dingy veterans hospital used to be. The team that came to Warm Springs was under the direction of DeBorah Williams, who is with the



Department of Veterans Affairs Medical Center, and is the Minority Veterans Program Director.

For the local Veterans who were in attendance were able to get a lot of information they needed and some didn't realize these programs were available for all the Veterans today. There are still many veterans who have questions today that could have been answered at the forum. To all veterans who might be wondering about services they have and to answers to your questions, they have the information available upon your request. Things like Medical Services, and the Programs, Education for Veterans, they even have information on housing, Compensation, employment.

There is even information for the Women's Veterans and services for them, and also the Veterans Center Programs.

The panel discussion in the afternoon was an open forum. The Medical was headed by Michael Bays, Chief Operating Officer; and for Veterans Benefits, was Virgil Hockett, Outreach Regional Office; For Employment, Mike Barker, ODAV Employment Department; Vet Center, Carl Whaley, of Salem.

There are even benefits for the Gulf War Veterans as well as any other conflict. No matter what war time era may be in question the needs are all the same. The WWI veteran was exposed to mustard gas, the WWII veterans were exposed to Ironizing radiation, and some Vietnam Veterans were exposed to Agent Orange. Many years after discharge many veterans suffered from exposure to those chemicals.
