Elvina "Ka-Mum-La-Shut" Switzler

Elvina "Ka-Mum-La-Shut" Stacona Switzler, age 87 passed away September 26, 1997 at the Mt. View Hospital due to natural causes. Mrs. Switzler was born September 18, 1910 at Warm Springs, Oregon to Charlie and Matilda (Parker) Stacona. She was a lifelong resident of Warm Springs and an enrolled member of the Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs reservation.

Elvina attended the Warm Springs Boarding school then went to Chemawa Indian School in Salem, Oregon. Upon returning to Warm Springs, she helped her mother at the ranch. She had four children from her first marriage and then married Jasper Switzler July 10, 1955 and they had five children.

A cooking career began when she cooked in the teacher's quarters on campus, then at the Rainbow Cafe, Alice's Restaurant and began at Kahneeta in 1964. She soon was promoted as head chef when the new restaurant opened where she stayed until her retirement in the early 1970s.

Mrs. Switzler enjoyed beadwork and making yarn belts. Upon becoming a resident at the Mt. View Nursing Home she began collecting Native American dolls and was very active as a Chairperson of their Activities Committee, coordinating trips and activities. Her favorite activity was "Bingo" which she enjoyed very much and

loved gifting her prizes to her grandchildren. She was a member of the Ladies VFW Elliott Palmer Post and the 1910 Indian Shaker Church.

Elvina had 26 grandchildren, 40 great-grandchildren and 3 great-great grandchildren with another due in November.

Survivors include her daughters Sidonia Santillano and Susan Coronado of Walla Walla, Washington, Leota Saunders and Beulah Calica of Warm Springs, sons Reuben Johnson, Sr. and Buford Johnson, Jr. of Warm Springs along with numerous relatives.

Preceding her in death are her husband, Jasper Switzler (9/12/69), children Cyril Johnson, Wilbert Herbie and Emil Switzler, four brothers, Roscoe, Curtis, McKie and Wilbert Switzler and three sisters Cecelia Greene, Rosanna Quibal and Inez Nejal.

An all denominational prayer service was held Friday, September 26, 1997 at 7 p.m. at the Warm Springs 1910 Indian Shaker Church. The dressing ceremony was held Saturday, September 27, 1997 at 3 p.m. at the Bel-Air Colonial Chapel in Madras, OR with Margaret Boise officiating. Following were two overnight services held Saturday and Sunday September 26, and 27, 1997 at the Shaker Church. Burial was held Monday September 29, 1997 at 10 a.m. at the Agency Cemetery with Clifford Moses officiating.
