New Veterans Home Dedicated recently

There is a new facility that opened up just recently, a 151-bed nursing home in The Dalles, Oregon, with a 25 bed unit for patents that have Alzheimer's disease.
The facility is the first to be built in Oregon, and across the country there are 42 states that have a total of 90 homes of this type. This home in has a spectacular view of the Columbia River, built on a bluff on the east end of The Dalles. Open only to men and women who are veterans of the U.S. Military, the home was built with proceeds from a \$4.7 million bond approved by residents of Wasco County and \$9.2 million in federal funds.
This is a first class health care unit and will be administered by Robert Fleming, public information manager for the state veterans affairs department.

Speakers at the dedication just recently included the Governor, John Kitzhaber, Hershel Gober, secretary designate of the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs, Jon A. Mangis, director of the Oregon Department of Veterans Affairs,
The operating cost will be paid by user fees. In approving the home's siting, the Oregon Legislature specifically said in the statute that "no general fund monies would be used for the operation of the home."Fleming said in an article from the Oregonian just recently. He added, "We believe that we will be able to succeed in making this home pay for itself."
Mr. Lyle Fraser, another spokesperson for the facility said, "at the present time there is already

a good list of applicants waiting for admission the new facility. The only requirements are recipients of the Medal of Honor will have first priority for residency upon application. At the present time there is one person who is a Medal of Honor recipient who is on the list for admittance at the present time. When ever the State and Federal inspectors complete their jobs on the facility than patients will be moving in.
To be eligible for admission, and individual must be a veteran, and Oregon resident, be in need of nursing home care, and also must be able to pay all costs of care that are not paid by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs.
