

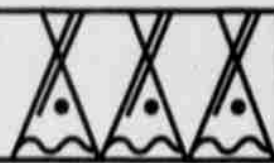


Showing respect for elders is an important part of Warm Springs tradition.

The Flood of 1996 left Kah-Nee-Ta Resort devastated. The Village was completely destroyed and the Golf Course was badly damaged.



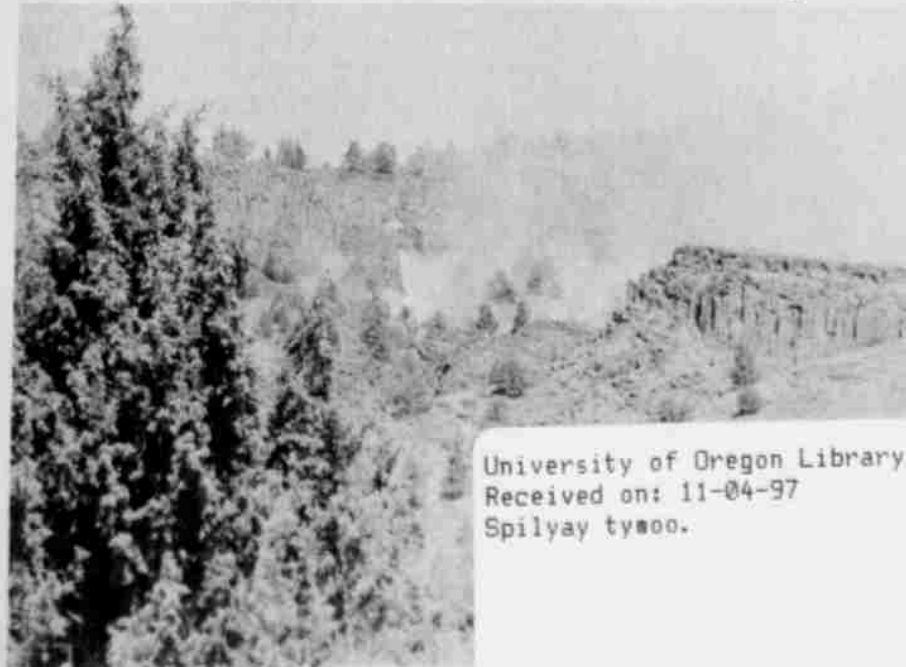
In October 1995, tribal leaders gathered to break ground for the first in-lieu fishing site promised by the US Government.
