


E Coosh EEWA: The way it is

I can remember as a "Cute Little Tyke," rushing home after school to turn on the radio and listen to, "The Adventures of Captain Midnight," Brought to you by Ovelteen, Kids drink Ovelteen and have adventures like Captain Midnight. My older sister always tuned in, "Your Hit Parade." The Number one song for the week. The songs in them days like, "I'll be seeing you; To Each His Own; Don't Sit Under The Apple Tree." It's Been A Long Long Time." "Sentimental Journey." In the day's of the big Bands with tunes like, "Tuxedo Junction," "Moonlight Serenade," "Wood Choppers Ball," "String of Pearls," "Star Dust," and many more.

Well back to "Pearl," and how visious the Japanese were during their rampage in the South Pacific, and how the American's started to regroup and make that long trek back regaining Island after Island in some real tough battles where many lives were lost. The war finally ended when the US, dropped the Atomic Bomb on Hiroshima and Nagasaki. Total distruction to the factory area and many many lives lost. Today there are demonstrations about the U.S. dropping the Atomic Bomb on Japan. Today no one really realizes how the Japanese were. If they didn't drop the bomb, there would have been double or even triple the number of deaths in taking the continent of Japan. Lives from both sides because they were going to fight to the death. The day I sat waiting for two hours to see a doctor, not one staff member had the courtesy to pop their head in my door, even once, to inform me the reason for the delay or how much longer I would be waiting or that I may want to consider rescheduling. Publicly I request the H & W doctor's administration or whomever to improve their appointment process for quality clinic care.


