Wasco Language Lesson Bear and Crane Legend

Ixtba Wigwa Monday



1) Daya kanúchk ismintwa kwadáu iqw'ashqw'ash. Aga gangadix shaxal ixstámx gachiuxúchgi wilx. Gachiuxúchgi gangadix kánawi dan itc'inunks gachdúx. Gachiuxúchgi ismintwa ayaguptida cháxalqlix.

This is the story of Bear and Crane. Long, long ago, the Creator made the world. He made all the animals and birds. He made Bear who sleeps all winter.

2) Kwapt gachiuxúchgi iqw'ashqw'ash, dāminwa illutwílal iwíqalba iwálalaba kwadáu iwímalba.

Then he made Crane, who is always standing around in the streams, lakes and rivers



3) Ismintwa iyaxik'ankwt, gatíl achaglgaya ak'ánaqi. T'ukti iyaxik'ankwt, dāminwa idyatilx. Aga kwapt gachiulgwima ayak'ánaqi iqw'ashqw'ash. Ismintwa

gachutaba saqw iqw'ashqw'ash ayak'ánaqi.

Bear was a fisherman. He was a good fisherman because he caught lots of fish and he always had lots. So he shared his fish with Crane. Bear caught all of Crane's fish.

4) Ixt wigwa ismintwa gachiulxam iqw'ashqw'ash, "Amxixlmama náikaba itqwlí." Kwapt gachdulaba itxashu, k'axsh gachiúx achiulgwima qawat itxashu.

One day, Bear said to Crane, "You come over to my place for a special dinner." Then bear dug a lot of clams, he wanted to share some clams with Crane.



5) Gayuyamx iqw'ashqw'ash ismintwaba idiáqwl, ismintwa gachdúksdamit itxlm iqw'ashqw'ash gayuláitx tk'i gachiúx ismintwa gachdúksdamit itxlm.

When Crane got to Bear's place, Bear was already cooking. Crane sat and watched Bear cook.

6) Gachdúksdamit itxashu kwapt ismintwa qikáyakba idiapápakwn, chx gachdúx awatulba.

To cook the clams, bear put a clam between his paws and warmed it over the fire.

7) Iqw'ashqw'ash aga wálu giuxt, gaciglukt ismintwa idiapápakwn laima ilk'acha, tai t'ukti lukshdixba kímangi igunat iliak'acha. Itlúqch idiak'acha idiapápakwnyamt awatulba. Tai aga wálu giuxt iqw'ashqw'ash, itlúqch idiak'acha awatulba gadulanan tai t'ukti, kwapt wa'au wálu gagiúx. Tai it'ukti dulanen.

Crane got hungry as he saw Bear's paws all full of fat, it looked so good...just like Salmon grease. Bear's fat dripped down from his paws into the fire. Crane got hunrier and hungrier. It smelled so good.

8) Kwapt saqw galdúksdamit itxashu, kwapt



gashkixlmchx, gashkixlmchx, gashkixlmchx chiwát. Tai t'ukti itxlm.

When Bear had cooked all the clams, they ate and ate until they were full. It was such a good meal.

9) Kwapt ismintwa galixank'ankwt, kwapt gachutaba ak'ánaqi, kwapt gachulgwima iqw'ashqw'ash.

Everyday Bear went fishing and as he caught fish, he shared them with Crane.

10) Iqw'ashqw'ash dauya wigwa, iqw'ashqw'ash gadilxlmux ak'ánaqi duwáki. "K'aya it'ukti kímangi dukst itxashu, galixlúxwait. "Galixlúxwait yáimaba, "Aaa t'ai, palalái gadnux'lák itxashu ismintwa gachdúksdamit awatulba. Kwaish ndukmit ilk'acha luwít awatulba. Tai t'ukti!

As Cranes do today, Crane ate the fish raw. "It isn't as good as cooked clams," he said to himself. He thought, "Boy, I really enjoyed those clams Bear cooked over the fire. I can still see the fat dripping onto the fire. It smelled so good."

11) Kwapt galikím yáxkaba, "P'ala dauka naika inyukstamit kímangi ismintwa dáwi áwachi mank it'uktix. C'ks yukshtix. Nxláit aníuxa. Alma xábixix anyuxa."

Iqw'ashqw'ash gachiglximchx ismintwa, "Náikayam itqwlí'ba itxlm. Kwapt gachiulxam, alma itxashu aditxlmuxma. Then he said to himself, "I bet I can cook as well as bear, or even better. It looks easy. I

know I can. I'll do it tonight." Crane invited Bear to come to his house for dinner. He told him, "We'll eat clams."

12) Ismintwa gayuya iqw'ashqw'ashba idiáqwl gangádaga gachdúksdamit axlúxtba awatul ilk'áp gachuxa. Gachulkchamit itxashu awatulba. Ismintwa dáwi gachdúx madnux k'aya dan ilk'acha galuwi idiak'ilakwityam qwatxalá idiak'ilakwit. K'aya dan iliak'acha.

When Bear went to Crane's place, Crane was already cooking over a hot fire he had fixed just right. He was roasting the clams. Crane was doing it just like bear, but there was no fat dipping from his bony legs because his legs were too skinny and they had no fat.



Gwnmaba Wigwa Friday



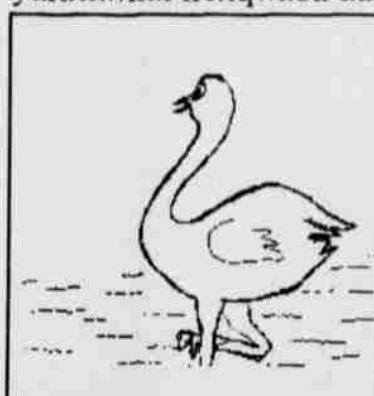
13) Qidaúba daya wigwa amiglgaya ismintwa yuqwiu yuxulgaxáimat idiapápakwn kwaish dat'á.

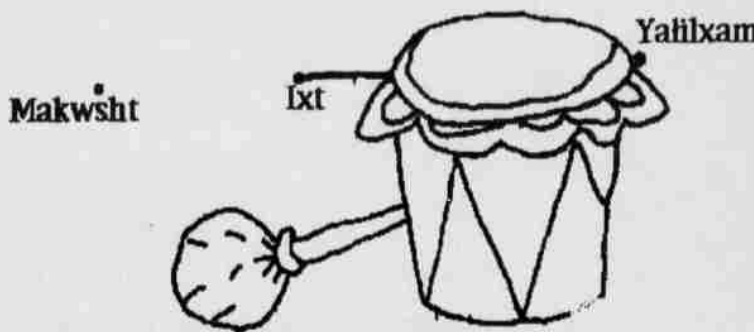
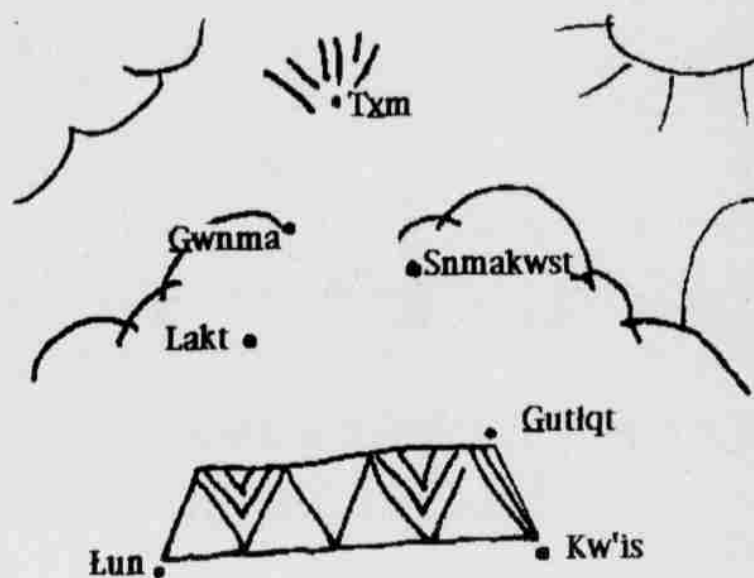
Chsh chsh chiúx iyac'ilakwit chawigwákt idiyáps.
