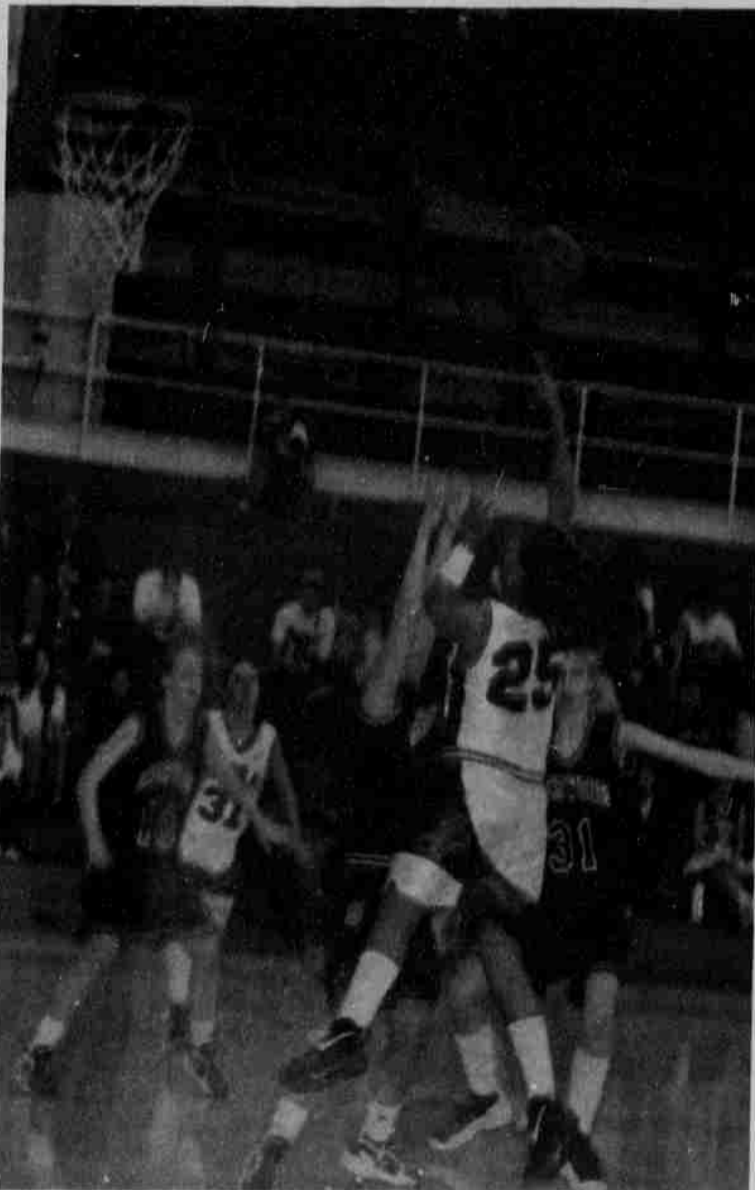

The Madras White Buffalos girls' varsity team beat Sherwood Lady Bowmen 60-27 and improved to 3-2 in Tri-Valley league play. TaraLee Suppah had a game high 19 points, also pulled down eight rebounds and Deece Suppah a team high nine rebounds to go with six points to lead the Lady Buffs to victory.

Madras who won the Seaside tourney over the Christmas break, looked a little rusty in the first quarter, and lead only nine to seven after one quarter. T. Suppah had four in the quarter and Mary Murphy kept the Lady Bowmen in the game with four points also.

In the second quarter, Madras team defense picked up and built a 23-8 lead. T. Suppah scored seven second quarter points to help Madras extend their lead.

In the third, Madras' defensive pressure allowed the Lady Bowmen only three points in the quarter while scoring 20 points of their own to take a commanding lead of 43-11 at the end of the third. Deece Suppah

became a factor in the game, with three steals, dished out four assists and scored six points in the third quarter.

In the fourth quarter, TaraLee Suppah scored eight points of the Lady Buffs' 17 points and Madras won going away 60-27. The victory was dampened by the injury of reserve guard Melanie Smith who injured her back with 44 seconds left in the game. Smith had to be carried off on a stretcher. The extent of her injuries were not known at press time.

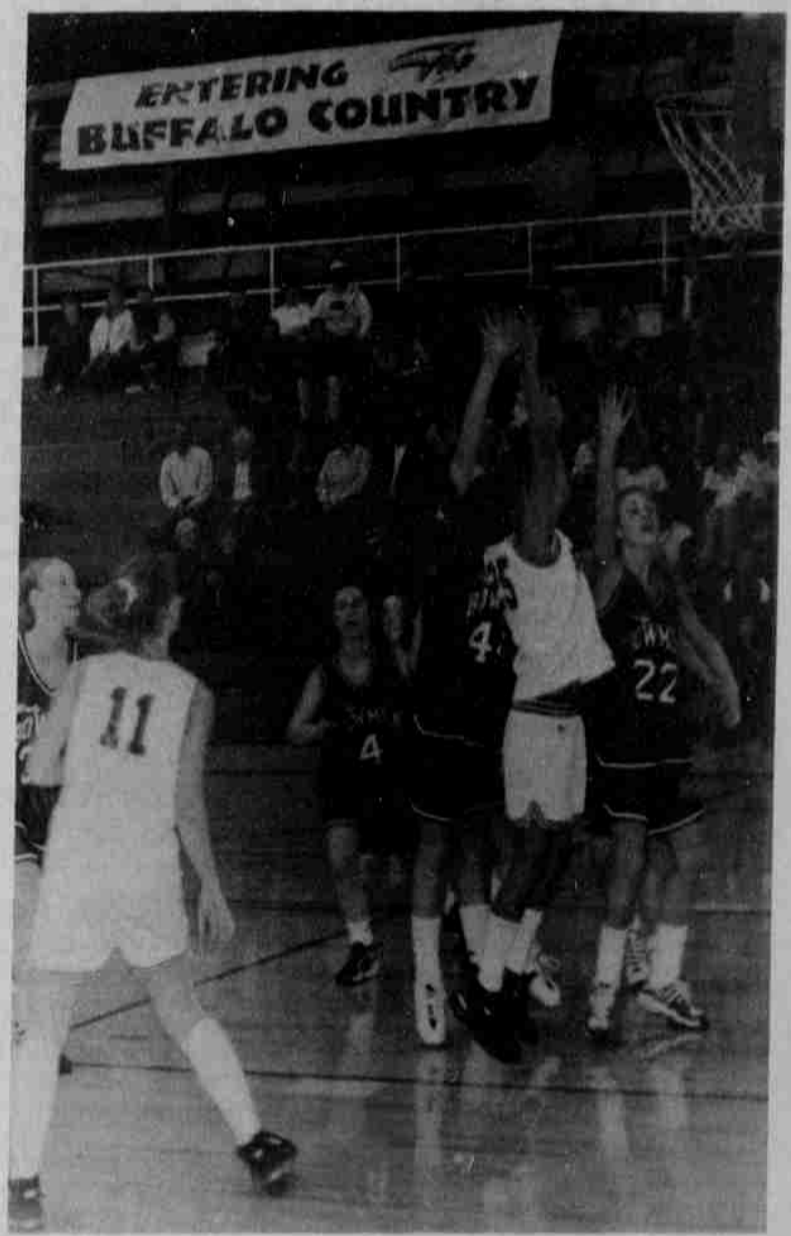
For the game, Madras out rebounded the Lady Bowmen 39-31 with Deece and TaraLee Suppah combining for 17 rebounds.

Lapwai defeats Yakama to win the Warm Springs All-Indian mens basketball Holiday tournament

The Nez Perce Nation team won the 39th Annual Warm Springs All-Indian Mens Holiday basketball tournament, held December 31 through January 3 1998. Lapwai defeated the Yakama Nation team in Championship 124-92. Mike Leslie, Lapwai, was named MVP for the tournament.

Two new Queens were crowned. Edna David, daughter of Ellison and Jonathan David Sr., was crowned Senior court queen and Daleena Frank, daughter of Jeffery Frank and Sandra Greene-Sampson, was crowned Junior court queen.

Game one, WS BlackHawks 92- Chiloquin 84

Game one, Warm Springs BlackHawks defeated Chiloquin 92-84. The BlackHawks advanced to the quarter-finals.

Game two was a forfeit NorthWest Chiefs advanced.

Game three, Yakama 113-WS Red Star 67

Game three, Warm Springs Red Star played Yakama Nation. Yakama came out on top by the score of 113-67. JoJo Mesplie 32 points lead seven players in double figures in scoring for Yakama. Yakama advanced to the quarter finals in the upper bracket with their victory.

Games four and five were forfeits so the Magpies advanced to the quarter-finals in the lower bracket and the BlackHawks advanced to the semi-finals in the upper bracket.

Game six, Yakama 113-Santa Clara 106

Game six, Santa Clara played Yakama Nation in the upper bracket quarter-final game. Yakama came from 13 points down in the first quarter to win 113-106.
