## Oregon Veterans' Benefits

About your benefits...All must be applied for

As a veteran, you have certain benefits you earned as a result of your service. Survivors and dependents of veterans may also have benefits available; however, these benefits are there for you only if you apply for them.

Because the laws covering veterans' benefits are very complex, you are urged to get help in applying for them. The necessity for personal assistance to veterans in filing and pursuing claims results from the legal principle that NO Veterans' benefits are awarded automatically.

The Oregon Department of Veterans' Affairs and most counties provide free benefits counseling and claims service to veterans survivors, and dependents. These veterans' advocates can help you obtain all your entitlements due.

When it comes to federal benefits, the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs cannot prosecute claims against itself. Therefore, veterans' service organizations or the Oregon Department of Veterans' Affairs will represent your claim for you before the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs. There is no fee for this service, and it is a good way to be certain you receive all the benefits you earned.

### FEDERAL BENEFITS

**compensation:** Monthly payments for service-incurred or service-aggravated disabilities. Disability retirees should apply and choose the greater benefit.

**#Pension:** Monthly benefits with rates according to other income, for disabilities not due to military service.

**#Housebound and A & A:** Special additional benefits for seriously disabled pensioners and those requiring nursing home care or special care at home.

**Outpatient Treatment:** Doctor's services and medicines at federal DVA expense for service-connected disabilities, and for all conditions if rated 50% or more service-connected; also, doctor's services and medicines at federal DVA expense for veterans entitled to additional pension as housebound or in need of regular aid and attendance (A&A)

**#Dependents' Medical:** Spouses and children of 100% service-connected disabled veterans entitled to doctor, medicine, and hospital benefits.

**#Hospital Care:** Priority for service-connected disabled veterans entitled to doctor, medicine, and hospital benefits, but available to veterans with non-service conditions who cannot afford private care.

**#Domiciliary Care:** Care and recreational programs for unemployable

disabled veterans whose disabilities do not prevent some self care.

**#Veterans' Education:** College, vocational school, apprenticeship, monthly GI Bill benefits, or the special vocational rehabilitation program for disabled veterans.

**#Dependents' Education:** Benefits for spouses and children of certain 100% service-disabled veterans for college or vocational subjects.

**#GI Insurance:** Special GI insurance for service-disabled veterans. Also, conversion, beneficiary changes, policy loans, dividends, and new "insurance additions".

**#GI Loans:** Guaranteed or direct home loans with low down payments for World War II and later veterans. Also, applies to mobile homes. There is no deadline for application.

### OREGON BENEFITS

**#State Veterans' Loans:** Loans for acquisition of homes to qualified Oregon veterans may be available, contact ODVA for more information (see Pamphlet 426-M).

**#State Educational Aid:** Up to \$50 per month to qualified veterans (see Pamphlet 431-M).

**Property Tax Exemption:** Exemptions of a portion of the value from property tax for veterans with disabilities of 40% or more.

**#Game Licenses:** Free permanent hunting and angling licenses to veterans disabled 25% or more.

**#Reemployment Rights:** Entitlement to old job, seniority, and pay with accrued status, upon release from services. Enforced under Federal Statutes.

**#Public Employment:** Veterans' preference in public employment. Additional preference for disabled veterans.

**#Conservatorship:** Estate management for certain veterans and dependents (see pamphlet 432-M).

**#Records:** Help in obtaining free certified copies of public records of marriage, death, divorce, and birth for claims purposes.

### Sylvia "Sma-Na Tee" Queahpama Wallulatum

Sylvia "Sma-Na Tee" Queahpama Wallulatum, 81 years, passed away Monday, January 26, 1998 at the Mt. View Hospital in Madras, Oregon. Mrs. Wallulatum was born December 18, 1917 in Simnasho, Oregon to parents Frank and Millie (Swan) Queahpama. She attended Warm Springs Boarding School and Stewart Indian School in Carson City, Nevada.

Beginning employment as a domestic service person in Oakland, California from 1939 to 1941, she then worked in the ship yards as a welder in Portland, Oregon from 1942 to 1945 then became a homemaker from that year forward.

Mrs. Wallulatum taught Sahaptin at the Simnasho school, cultural values, and songs with the interpreting of the songs for our young people. She was a member of the Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs, the Auxiliary to Veterans of Foreign Wars of the USA and The Simnasho Lincoln's Birthday Powwow.

Preceding her in death are first husband Foster Sahme, daughter; second husband Felix Wallulatum; parents Frank & Millie (Swan) Queahpama; sisters May John, Matilda Mitchell & Katherina Queahpama; brothers Oscar & Clayton Queahpama.

Survivors include four sons Sylvester Sahme, Sr.; Milton, Jim F. and Gene Sahme; sister Nettie Shawaway all of Warm Springs and numerous relatives and friends.

Casket bearers were JoDe Goudy, Mac McCloud, Juan Mesteth, Sylvester, Jr., Kenneth, William, TeWaNe and W. Foster Sahme. Alternate casket bearers were Rafael & Harry Queahpama and Guy Wallulatum.

Special instructions: "My wish is to have men and boys seated on the

South side of the Longhouse and all the women and girls seated on the North side of the Longhouse. All women & girls in attendance shall be dressed in a wing dress. All men & boys dress in traditional dress or at least in ribbon shirt and moccasins."

"All speakers who go to the center near the casket shall not sing a slow or prayer song. These songs should be sung while seated. This takes a long time and people who are standing tire by having to stand to long."

"Three of my sons are members of and participate in, the Sun Dance Society. I would therefore, like to have them use the Sun Dance songs at the cemetery. When the vehicle reaches the first gate at the cemetery and my body is being removed from the vehicle and carried to the gravesite, they will sing the Sun Dance songs."

A Prayer Service was held Thursday, January 29, 1998 at 10 a.m. at the Bel-Air Colonial Funeral Home for all denominations. The Dressing Ceremony was held January 29, 1998 at 3 p.m. at the Simnasho Longhouse with Gail Turcotte and Louise Hellon officiating. Overnight Washut services were held with Pierson Mitchell officiating Burial was Friday, January 30, 1998 at the Simnasho Cemetery at sunrise.
