

The Oregon Red Cross is announcing a new law that requires alama 2, Smith 2, Klos 1, and Duff youth ages 12 and under must wear LaSalle-Ricards 13, Powell 6, a life jacket, when the boat is underway. This new law will be in

effect starting February 12. The Oregon State Marine Board, the state recreational boating agency, now requires youngsters to wear life jackets whiling the boat is moving. Previously, boaters were only required to carry life jackets to fit all passengers on board and to have them readily accessible. The Marine Board has been concerned that young children may not be able to put on their life jackets in a emergency and that children who fall overboard are at great risk.
