Tribal Council appoints committee members

The Warm Springs Tribal Council recently appointed committee members to the Tribe's eight executive committees. Resolution No. 9565 notes the new committee members.

"Whereas, The Tribal Council is the governing body of the Confederated Tribes; and,

"Whereas, Article IV, Section II of the Tribal Constitution and By-Laws provides that the Tribal Council may select such committees as it may deem necessary to properly conduct the business of the Tribal Council; and,

"Whereas, There are currently eight such committees including the Culture and Heritage Committee; Education Committee; Fish and Wildlife On-Reservation Committee; Fish and Wildlife Off-Reservation Committee; Health and Welfare Committee; Land Use/Planning Committee; Range, Irrigation and Agriculture Committee and Timber Committee; and,

"Whereas, The Tribal Council believes that it is important to give the committee clear statement of their purpose, mission, powers, operational guidelines and responsibilities; and,

"Whereas, The Tribal Council hereby appoints the committee members to the current term to serve until

now committees are appointed 60 days after the next term of the Tribal Council; and,

"Whereas, The committee members are to take the oath of office on A DATE TO BE DETERMINED BY TRIBAL COUNCIL AT A LATER DATE; now; therefore,

"Be it resolved, By the Tribal Council that the members will receive \$7.50 per hour for their services, plus a mileage allowance of 15 cents per mile to and from headquarters, with the exception that the Culture and Heritage Committee will receive \$8 per hour for their services plus a mileage allowance of 15 cents per mile to and from headquarters; and,

"Be it further resolved, By the Tribal Council of the Confederated Tribes of the Warm Springs Reservation pursuant to Article IV, Section II of the Tribal Constitution and By-Laws that the Committee membership shall be as follows:

"The undersigned, as Secretary-Treasurer of the Confederated Tribes of the Warm Springs Reservation of Oregon, hereby certifies that the Tribal Council is composed of 11 members of whom 10, constituting a quorum, were present at a meeting thereof, duly and regularly called,

noticed, convened and held this 19th day of June, 1998; and that the foregoing resolution was passed by the affirmative vote of eight members, one member opposed and the Chairman not voting; and that said resolution has not been rescinded or amended in any way."
