- 1 12-inch ruler (inches and centimeters)
- Notebook paper
- 1 Box of tissues

**Sixth Grade**

- 1 Box 16 or 24 small crayons
- Pencils, size #2
- Pink Pearl Erasers
- 1 Pair of sharp-point scissors
- 1 4-oz. bottle white glue
- 1 12-inch ruler (inches and centimeters)
- Notebook paper
- 1 Box of tissues
- Ballpoint pens, blue or black (not erasable)

**Seventh and Eighth Grades**

- College-ruled notebook paper
- 1 2-inch, 3-ring (metal ring) binder with dividers
- No PeeChee folders
- Students are not allowed permanent markers**
- Note:** Some classes may require additional materials. If so, students will be notified during the first week of school by their classroom teacher. Some schol supplies will need to be replenished throughout the year.

men to the Madras High School. It is a great achievement to move up and know that you've made it. And I'm sure that parents/grandparents/guardians are very proud of you.

I would like you to know that attending school prepares you older children for the work force and when your parents are yelling at you to get out of bed, that is just what they are doing. Because you will not have someone there to get you up and ready for work. So, when your parents are waking you for school, remember that whatever job/career you are thinking about pursuing in your life attending school is going to get you there.

I would also like you to know that tribal law requires you students to attend and parents to send children to school. I know I have spoken to some of the students about this tribal law
