The Buffs pretty well controlled the first half of the game after a slow start but led at half time 32-24, on a turn-over riddled game.

The Buffs did a good job under the basket despite being shorter than the host Wilsonville team.

Jorge Mora paced the Buffaloes with 17 points, (all statistics unofficial) as he unloaded for three 3 point baskets for the winners. A lot of the Wildcats baskets came from tip-ins by the taller team. Travis Mochetti and Alex Hiller each had a 3 pointer for the Buffs.

In the second half the wildcats came storming back to take a short lead and all through the second half the lead changed hands several times. With less than a minute left the Buffs were handling the ball in the front court when Jon Dinelli of Wilsonville

stole the ball and went in for the easy two, with 18 seconds remaining on the clock in regulation play. Mora brought the ball down court at a slow pace letting the clock run down and with just 5 seconds left he made a drive toward the basket and goes up in the air than bounce passes to McCabe who laid in the final two points to put Madras up 57-56. Wilsonville called time out with 3.5 seconds left, when play resumed.

Wilsonville made a desperation shot that went wide as the final buzzer sounded giving the Buffalo's the big win.
