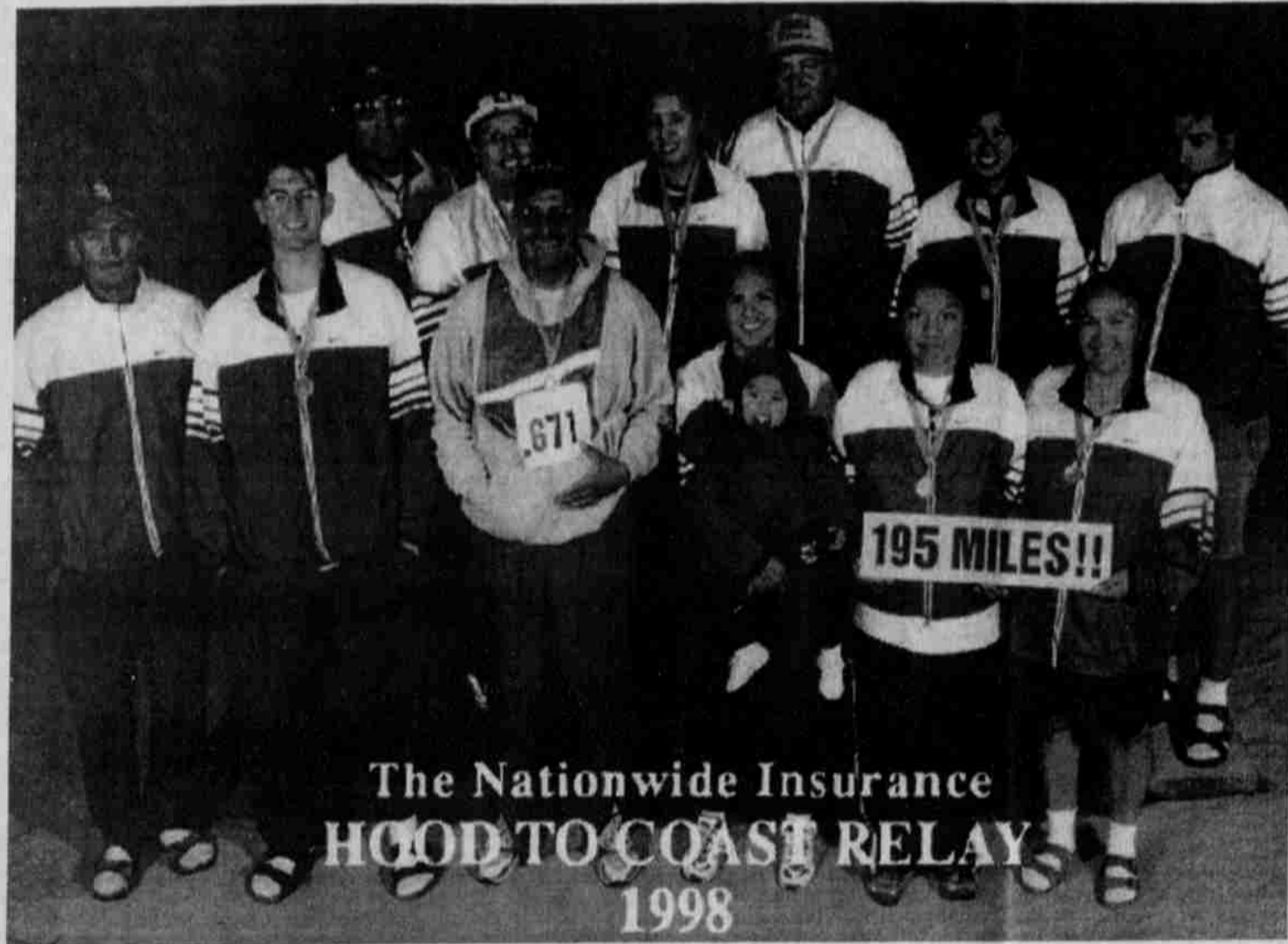

Next up for the lady buffs is Valley Catholic and the Sherwood Bowemen, both games starting at 7:30.

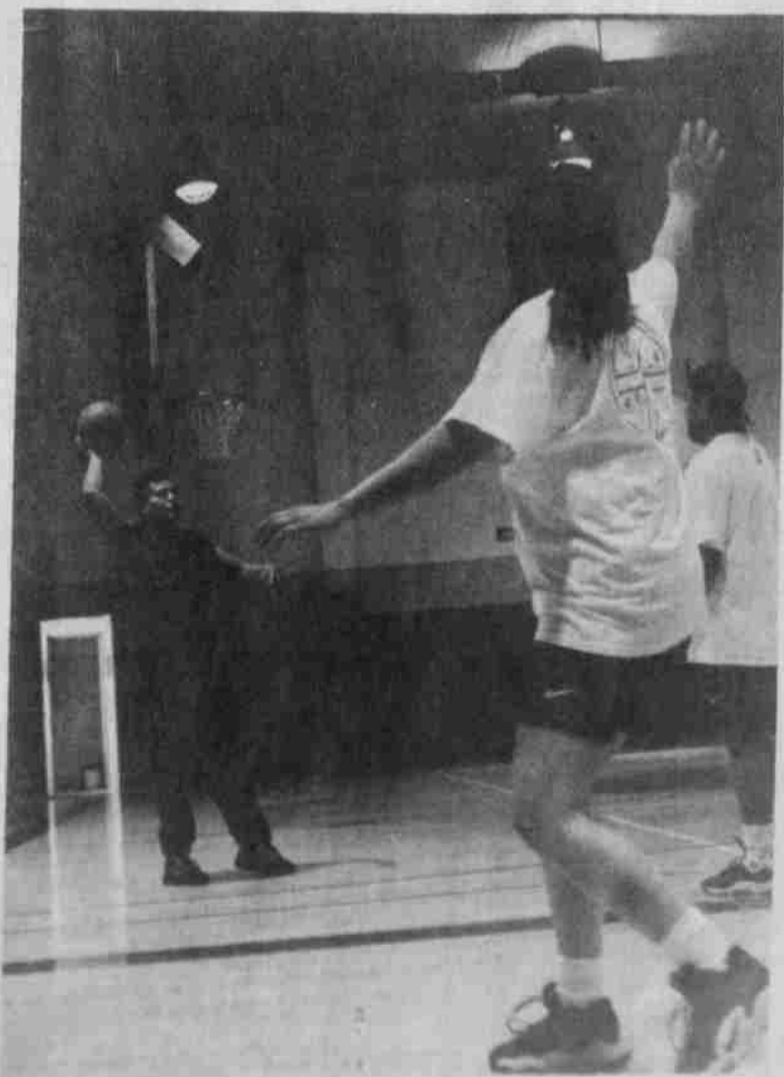
Recreation starts new league at noon time
