The relay only had four teams turn out for the event, but the participants still enjoyed the run.

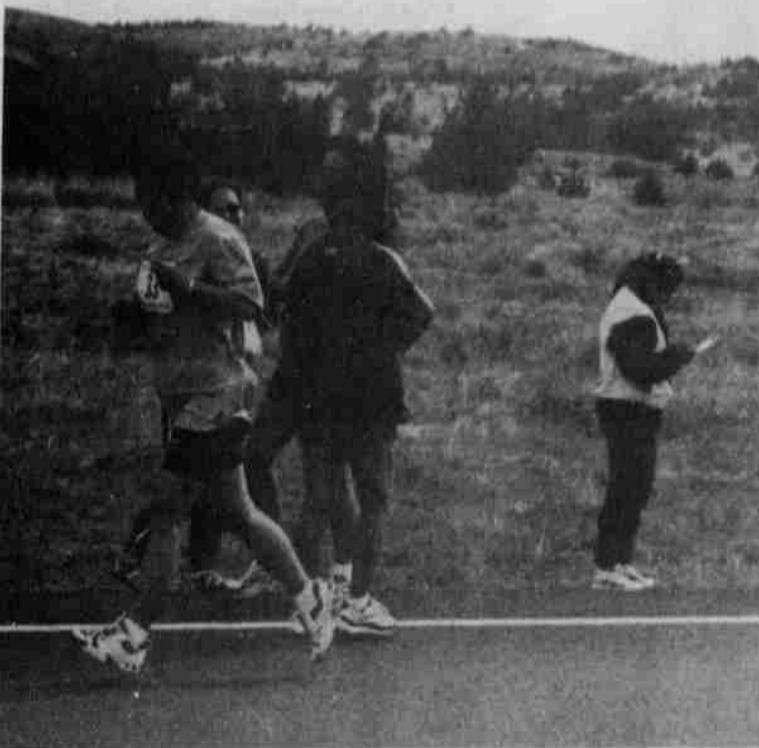
