The Madras Rotary Invitational was held on Saturday May 8, 1999 at the Madras High School.

Teams that participated were Crook County, LaPine, Central, Cascade, Gilchrist, and Madras.

Andrea Krugle paced the buff girls placing in four events. She took first in the Pole Vault, third in the 200 Meters, fourth in the High Hurdles, and fifth in the Triple Jump. Heather Klos was right behind her placing in three events. She placed fourth in the 800 Meters, sixth in the 300 Hurdles, and seventh in the Long Jump. Ashlyn Lofting got second in the Discuss and fourth in the Shot Put. Her sister Rachel placed seventh in both the Discuss and the Shot Put. Leila Woll came in second in the 3000 Meters to round out the scoring for the lady buff track squad.

Lee Zumwalt lead the way for the

buffs winning the 3000 Meters with a time of 10:01:35. Gabe Walker came in second in the Triple Jump with a jump of 38'4". James Johnson placed second in the Shot Put with a throw of 41'9". Chad McFarland placed third in the Pole Vault with a jump of 9'0". Mark Creelman placed fourth in the 800 Meters with a time of 2:05:89. Aaron Fisher came in fifth place in the 300 Hurdles with a time of 45.60. James Wolfe placed sixth in the 400 Meters with a time of 58.21. Noe Sanchez placed seventh in the Javelin with a throw of 145'9". Hoyt Downing placed eighth in the Triple Jump with a jump of 34'7".

Next up for the buffs is the District Track Meet which will be held in Madras on May 21 & 22, 1999. The meet starts at 3:00 on Friday and at 10:00 on Saturday.

Tips from "Joe" the Pro at Kah-Nee-Ta

As Spring arrives so does the wind. Here are a few quick reminders that may help you survive the gusts.

Going downwind the wind will straighten your shot out as well as take a lot of backspin OFF the ball. So while your tee shots will run more so will your approaches, pitches, and chips into the greens. So plan for more run on the greens. I also recommend teeing off with a three wood for two reasons, 1) You will get the ball up in the wind so it

can "ride" it, and 2) The driver puts the least amount of backspin on a ball so a strong tailwind can actually knock a driver down.

Into the wind the number one thing to remember is to swing easy, you have all heard it, now let me explain why. The harder you hit a shot the more spin you will put on it, the harder the wind blows the more your mistakes are magnified. A little slice becomes big, a little hook goes out of control. By swinging easier you will

put less on the ball, letting it bore through the wind much easier, and keeping those errant shots on the course. The good news is your chips and pitches will stop quicker, so you can throw those aggressively at the hole.

In any strong wind you may try to widen your stance so you are able to keep your balance on all shots. Other than that be patient, and remember it is a game.
