A unique fundraiser- the American Cancer Society's Relay For Life- is coming to Madras in July. The fundraiser takes place from 10 in the morning on Saturday, July 17, until 10 the following morning.

Relay For Life participants organize in teams of 8 to 12 people, who take turns traveling around the quarter-mile track at Madras High School, relay-style for a full 24 hours.

Teams from businesses, churches, civic groups and families join the fun of the overnight campout, enjoying food, entertainment, games and the camaraderic that comes from supporting a good cause.

Each team member is asked to raise \$100 in sponsorship money to participate in the event, and those who raise money will earn prizes.

Team members take turns
