Snake bite victim listed stable

Warm Springs resident Julie Meanus, 41 years of age was transported to Mt. View Hospital, Monday evening July 26; with a suspected rattlesnake bite to her foot. She was treated and stabilized at Mt. View and then transferred to Central Oregon District Hospital in Redmond. She is listed in fair condition.

The incident occurred approximately 5pm Monday. She was walking from the Warm Springs Plaza area along Highway 26 and then behind the Texaco down a footpath.

Search nets 18 plants

Narcotics Search Warrant by James Cole, Detective WSPD & CODE

On July 20, 1999 at approximately 11:00 a.m. The Warm Springs Police Department with the assistance of the Central Oregon Drug Enforcement Team executed a search warrant at 5440 M300 Road, Warm Springs, OR where detectives seized 18 growing marijuana plants and several items of assorted drug paraphernalia.

Deborah Scott, 44, of Warm Springs was arrested and charged with cultivating the marijuana plants.

The plants were approximately two feet tall and weighed in at approximately 5 pounds. One firearm was also seized during the conduct of the warrant.
