

Two departments seek comments from tribal public

Forestry and Natural Resources employees are seeking comments from the tribal public on how to update IRMPI, the Integrated Resources Management Plan for the Forested Area. The current plan will be in effect until December 31, 2001 and Tribal Council has directed the staff to have a draft plan prepared nine months in advance of the expiration date

IRMPI was adopted as Ordinance 74 by a vote of the Tribal Council in 1992. Their decision supported a staff recommendation to use a balanced management approach, which provides adequate protection for natural resources and opportunities for compatible economic enterprises.

An objective to manage the commercial forest on a sustained-yield basis was also endorsed by Tribal Council, establishing an annual allowable cut of approximately 52 million board feet, a figure that was phased in during the first five years after the plan was implemented.

Other key elements of the plan include the establishment of goals,

objectives standards and best management practices. Goals and objectives establish targets for managers to shoot towards. They are far-reaching policy statements used to gauge whether or not the plan is achieving desired conditions.

Standards are measurable and enforceable directives covering a wide variety of activities, including road construction, skid trails, riparian buffers, cultural plants and many other topics. Best management practices provide guidelines that should be followed whenever feasible.

IRMP I also contains management direction for water and soil, conditional use areas, long-term productivity islands, fire, rural housing, forage, fuelwood, timber, fish and wildlife, recreation, planning and archaeological resources.
