

4th Quarter Rally Estacada Beats White Buffalos 32-19



On a big gainer on a pass from Barnes to Christensen put the ball down on the 5 yard line, the Rangers put up their goal line stand, but that didn't stop Jake Jaca as he took the hand off and bullied his way into the end zone and hit pay dirt for the go ahead TD, behind some good blocking from No 54 Allan Jackson in foreground. The TD put the Buffs ahead 19-18, as they led at the end of the third quarter.

The Estacada Rangers had to come from behind to win the game after trailing going into the fourth quarter, on Friday night, Oct. 15, by the score of 32-19.

John Day Pool Setline Season: Opens 6 a.m. Monday, October 11, 1999. Bonneville and The Dalles pools are closed. Only setline gear may be used. The fishery will close at 6 p.m. December 31, 1999 or when the catch guideline of 1,160 is reached.

Area: John Day Pool only

season will be restricted to sturgeon. Chinook and Steelhead may not be sold.

Sturgeon Size Limit: Sturgeon between 4 feet and 5 feet in length may be sold commercially or kept for subsistence.

Scaffold Fishery: The scaffold fishery remains open year-around.
