One rule enforced by the league is that you can not have a team that has already been taken. If you have a favorite team, you might want to make contact with the MFL as soon as possible. If not, you may not be able to get the team of your choice. MFL rule number 2 is, if you are under 18 years of age, the MFL can only award you a gift certificate instead of cash.

When Raymond Riddle formed the MFL, it was because the football game was fun. Now it has become more of a job for Riddle because he has to make all the game schedules and keep all the game stats.

Riddle must make sure everything runs smooth and understands that this is part of the things that has to be done before every game.

## OSAA Board of Directors move Schools from 3A to 4A and lowers others

The Oregon Schools Activities Association Up-Date

For the sports minded person(s), The OSAA Executive Board met on December 6, 1999, in Wilsonville for its quarterly meeting.

Every four years, the board automatically re-aligns its four classifications (4A, 3A, 2A, 1A) based on student enrollment, commonly referred to as Average Daily Membership (ADM) figures. The current four-year block expires at the end of the 2001-2002 school year.

In addition, the OSAA Constitution requires that the board examine the ADM figures for each of its member school each December. These numbers are arrived at by

adding attendance figures collected four times through the course of the school year and dividing by four to arrive at an Average Daily Membership.

The board also has the option at this time each year to move schools either up or down to a different classification depending upon their ADM figures.

The OSAA has set classification cutoff points as follows, Class 4A - 825 or more; Class 3A - 301-824; Class 2A - 110-300; 1A - 109 or fewer.

After reviewing schools with ADM's above the cut off points the board elected to move St. Helens and Woodburn up from Class 3A to Class 4A beginning with the 2000-2001 school year. St Helens will

join Class 4A District 4 (Three Rivers Conference), while Woodburn will join Class 4A District 9 (Pac-8 Conference).

The board also heard requests for Emergency Placement in a Lower Classification from schools whose enrollment fell under the classification minimum. The board elected to move LaGrande from Class 4A to Class 3A District 7 (Greater Oregon League); Umatilla from Class 3A to Class 2A District 7 (Columbia Basin Conference); and Mohawk from Class 2A to Class 1A District 1 (Casco League).

The next Executive Board meeting will be held February 7, 2000 at 9 a.m. at the Holiday Inn in Wilsonville.
