LaSalle Falcons outlast the Madras White Buffs 55-39

"As I See's Um!" Madras white Buffaloes plagued with turn-over-ites, early in the game dug a rut for themselves and were unable to climb out or overcome and regain their composure when the LaSalle Falcons came to town for the return league game of the season and they went home with a 55-39, win.

The Falcons took the tip and seemed to take control of the game right from the start, when they jumped right out to a 17-8, first quarter lead and were never in any serious trouble the rest of the night.

The Buffs couldn't get any kind of offense going or they couldn't get any kind of game going, as it appeared that there was a mental block that took over on the Buffs.

During the early part of the game the Buffs were passing right into the hands of the Falcon players and they would go down the floor and score. The teams went into the locker room for the half-time break with the Falcons leading 30-15.

Things didn't change too much in the second half and the Buffs battled their opponents head to head but several lay-ups were missed and sometimes even tips were not there and the Falcons would come away with the rebound.

Dean Scrutton was the man of the night for the LaSalle Falcons as he went on an 18 point scoring spree. The senior Post had six field goals and he was six out of seven from the free throw line. The taller Falcons were not to be denied under the basket pulling down most of the rebounds and

they went to a 41-23, lead at the end of the third quarter.

Jeff William's, a 6'7" freshman came into the game and with the limited time he played he dropped in six field goals right from under the basket for a total of 12 points, to be second high scorer for the Falcons.

Jorge Mora and Chasan Walker each had 9 points apiece for the Buffaloes to lead in the scoring department. Both had identical scoring with five field goals and one out of two free shots to give them the 11 points apiece.

Jake Jaca added 6 points for the Buffs with three field goals,

but the Falcons seemed to control the court on both ends of the floor. The Falcons of LaSalle will be around for a year or two as there will be a good return of players for the next season.

Despite being over shadowed by the taller Falcons the Buffs made a good run at them and even at times they out hustled them for the loose ball. But it was at the beginning of the game where they were in turn over trouble that got them so far behind and they were unable to catch up.

The Buffs will have a bye before traveling to meet the

Wilsonville Wildcats on their home floor. The Wildcats are a team to be watched as they have some height on their team also. The season is running down to the last weeks of action before the play-offs begin toward the State Tournament.

"As I See's Um!" A 20 point performance by Chasan Walker and 16 points from Jacoby Ellsbury highlighted the win over the visiting The Dalles Indians here in the Madras White Buffalo dome, Tuesday night Feb. 22, with game time starting at 7:30 p.m. The Buffaloes went on to romp the Indians by the score of 77-45, in a near capacity crowd of home town fans.

The Buffaloes were never in any kind of trouble all through the game, as they went on a 23-12, scoring binge in the opening quarter, but in the second quarter they went a little cold but managed to out score The Dalles 11-9, to take 34 to 21 half time lead and continue on the path toward the state title adding another win under their belts.

In the third quarter the Buffaloes got back into their stride when Walker opened fire from three point land and scoring ten points in the third quarter. Chasan Walker had 4 three pointers for the night and sat out most of the final period. During the game Walker was 4 of 5 from the three point line and 7 out of 11 for two point buckets and he was 2 of 4 from the charity stripe.

The final quarter belonged to reserve guard Jacoby Ellsbury as he came into the game and went on a little scoring binge getting four field goals and two foul shots for ten points in the final quarter. Ellsbury had six offensive rebounds and four defensive rebounds for the game for a total of ten rebounds for the night.

Jake Jaca had another good as a team leader getting two offensive rebounds and five defensive rebounds for a total of seven rebounds for the game, and scored 11 points as he was 5 from the

floor and 1 on 6 from the foul line.

The whole team had a good night, Jay McCabe turned in a 11 point game and had five rebounds for the game. Keller Christensen added nine points as he had four of five for field goals and one of two at the foul line. Christensen had four rebounds for the game two on each end of the floor.
