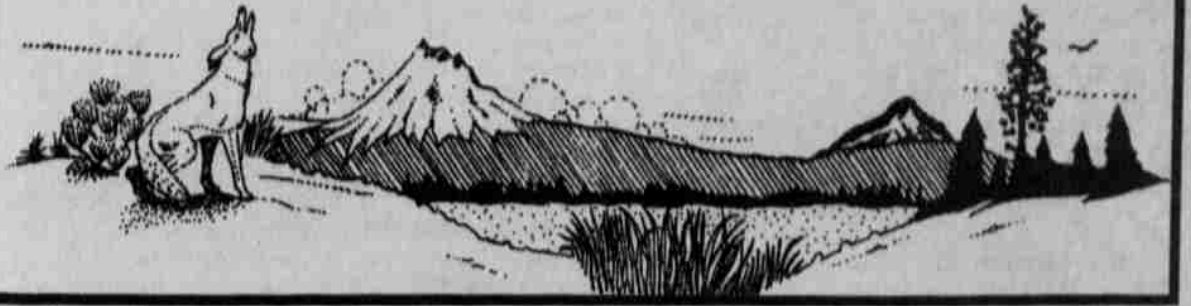
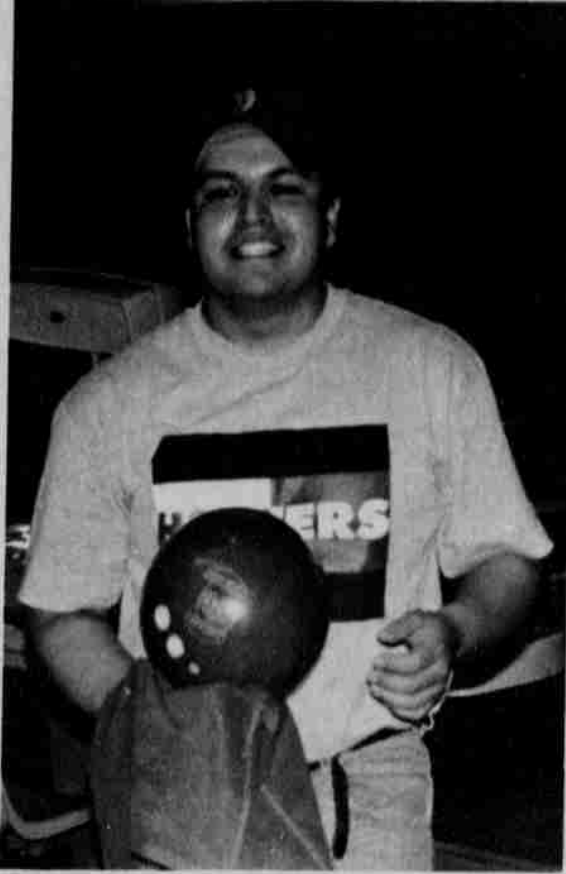


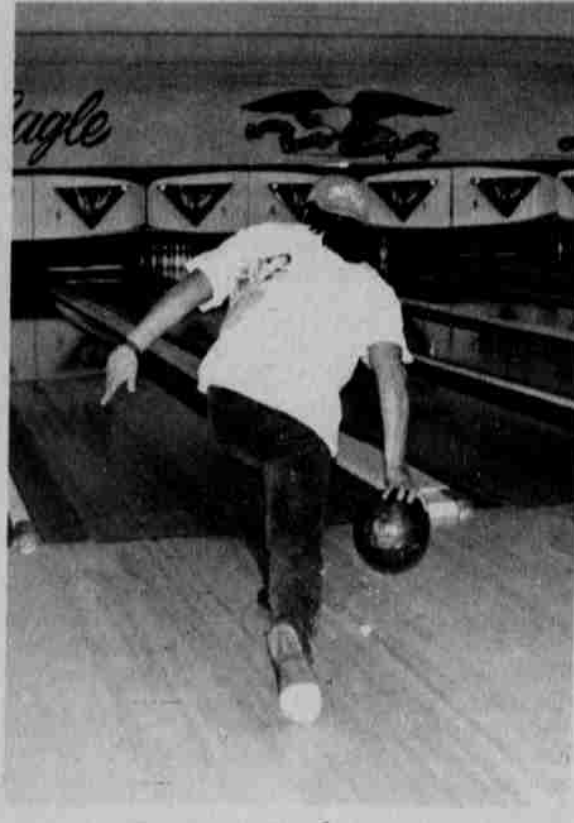

The program will be moderated by Cokie Roberts of ABC News. The discussion panel includes distinguished experts representing a variety of professions and perspectives.

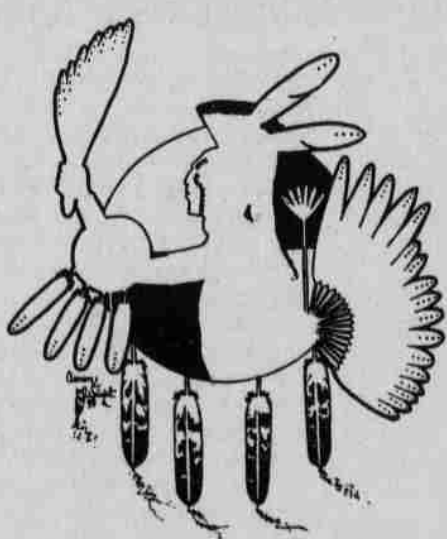
The teleconference is sponsored by Service Corporation International, with additional support from Project on death in America. Continuing Education credits will be available for a wide range of professions.
