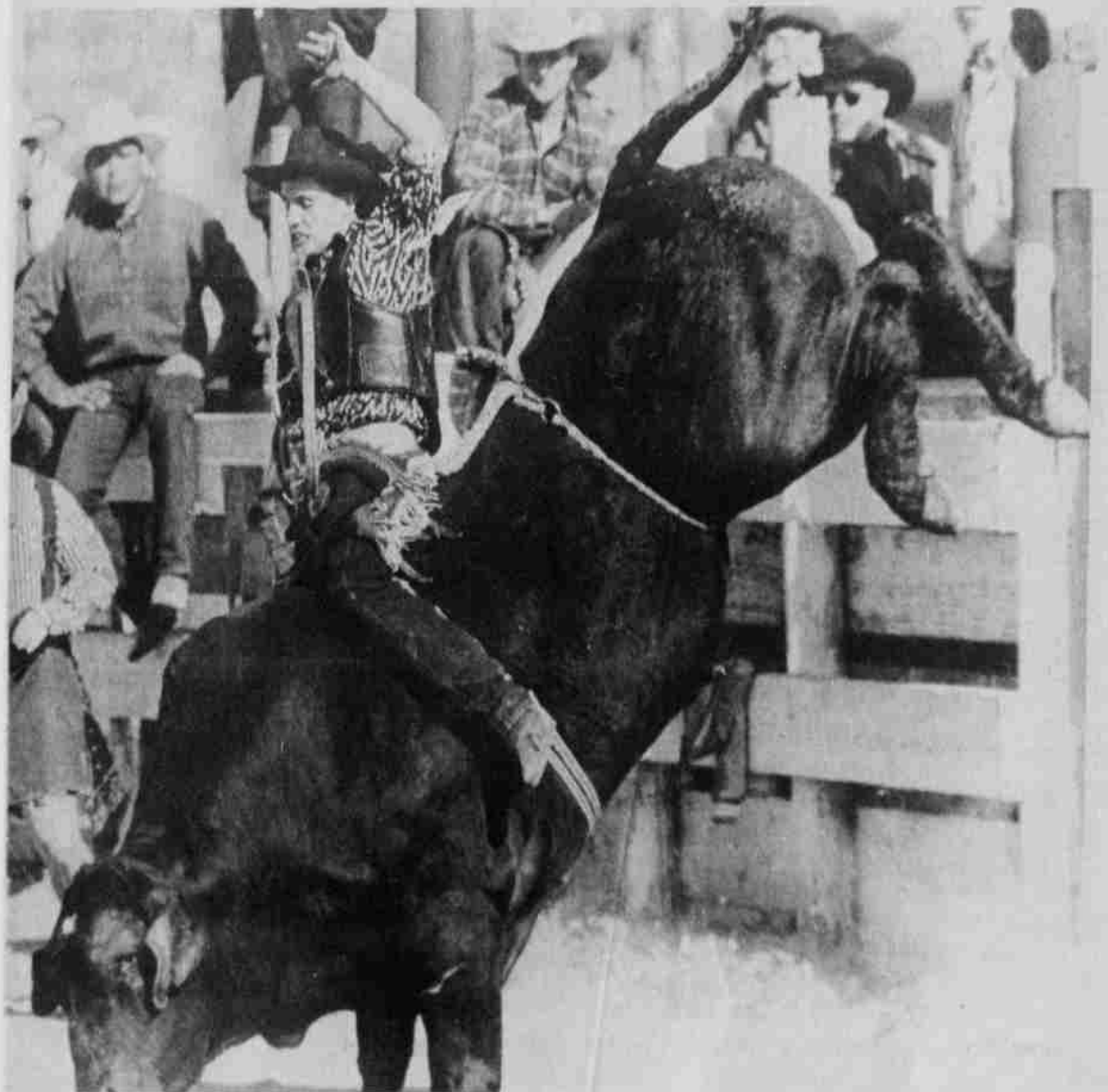

All participants received a medal for their efforts.

"This is something I've been planning for a long time," said Bruce Marcellay, promoter for the "Millenium 2000 Open Rodeo". "This rodeo will be a place where the whole family can come and have a good time", explains Mr. Marcellay. Marcellay thought that it would be a good idea to get the word out, so all horse racers would have a chance to get their horses legged up to

race. The races will be open start 1/4 mile and 1/2 mile. The feature race will be the "Thrilling" Pony Express Race.
